The humble Address of the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Worcester.

WE, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Worcester, in Council assembled, your Majesty's most faithful and loyal subjects and devoted servants, humbly beg to approach your Majesty with the warmest assurance of attachment to your throne and person, and to express our earnest and sincere congratulations upon the auspicious conclusion of a definite Treaty for the restoration of Peace, between your Majesty and your august Allies and His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of All the Russias.

We fervently hope and pray that the Peace so established may, under the favour of Divine Providence, long continue to shed its blessings over Europe, and that harmony amongst Governments, and friendly intercourse among Nations, may steadily promote the progress of civilization, the advancement of religion, and the welfare and happiness of mankind.
