The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Lisbon, transmitting copy of a recent Portuguese Royal Decree, fixing as follows the import duties upon the undermentioned articles:—

- Foreign maize to come under provisions of Articles 1 and 2 of Law of 3d July 1856, i. e., payment of 20 reis per alquiere.
- 2. Foreign salt to pay 10 reis per 100 lbs.
- 3. Foreign oil to pay 1,200 reis per 100 lbs.

4. Vessels importing full cargoes of cereals will be exempted from payment of tonnage dues; and vessels importing part cargoes of cereals will be exempted from tonnage dues in proportion to the quantity.

The provisions of the Decree are to continue in force until the end of June 1857.

Notice to Masters and Only Mates of Foreign Going Ships.

THE following additions to the qualifications now required from persons applying for Certificates of competency for Foreign going ships, will be made after the 31st March 1857:—

All Masters of Foreign going ships, in addition to the subjects of examination prescribed in the Notice of Examination issued in 1855, will be examined in so much of the laws of the tides as is necessary to enable them to shape a course and to compare their soundings with the depths marked on the charts.

All Only Mates must be nineteen years of age, and must have been five years at sea; and, in addition to the qualifications required in the Notice above referred to, must be able to find the longitude by chronometer in the usual way.
