Señor Don Luis Gonzalez Bravo, Envoy

mittee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations

of a Spanish Royal Order annulling the provisions
of the Royal Order of the 26th January and 7th
February last, permitting the free importation
into Spain of Foreign rice, which will henceforth
be charged at the rate of duty laid down in the
existing tariff.
