BUCKINGHAM PALACE, March 16, 1857.

THIS day had audience of Her Majesty; Señor Don Luis Gonzalez Bravo, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Queen of Spain, to deliver his credentials:

To which audience he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Clarendon, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Major-General the Honourable Sir Edward Cust, K.C.H., Her Majesty's Master of the Ceremonies.

Board of Trade, Whitehall, March 17, 1857.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her

Majesty's Minister at Madrid, transmitting copy of a Spanish Royal Order annulling the provisions of the Royal Order of the 26th January and 7th February last, permitting the free importation into Spain of Foreign rice, which will henceforth be charged at the rate of duty laid down in the existing tariff.
