August 28, 1857.

THIS Evening, at Thirty Minutes past Six o'clock, Her Most Gracious Majesty THE QUEEN, accompanied by His Royal Highness The PRINCE CONSORT, the Royal Family, and Suite, arrived at Her Majesty's Royal Palace of Holyrood.

On Her Majesty's arrival a Royal Salute was fired from the Guns of the Castle.
