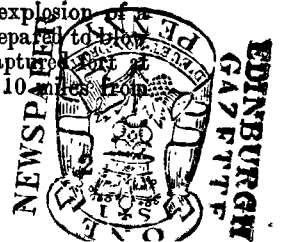

1. The principal purposes which the National survey should subserve :
2. The progress which has been made in the survey, and the scales upon which the maps and plans have hitherto been drawn and published :
3. The change or changes in those scales, or in any of the details of the survey, which, according to your judgment, should be made :
4. The estimated cost of completing the surveys of England and Wales, Scotland and Ireland, respectively, which you recommend to be adopted.

And for the better enabling you to form a sound judgment on the premises, We do hereby authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to call before you all such persons as you may judge most competent by reason of their situation, knowledge, and experience, to afford you correct information on the subject of this enquiry.

And it is Our further will and pleasure that you, or any three or more of you, do report to Us, under your hands and seals, your several proceedings by virtue of this Our Commission, together with your opinions on the several matters submitted for your consideration. And We will and command that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, although the same may not be continued from time to time by adjournment. And for your assistance in the due execution of this Our Commission, We have made choice of Our trusty and well-beloved George Gabriel Stokes, Esquire, to be Secretary to this Our Commission, and to attend you, whose services and assistance We empower you to avail yourselves of from time to time as occasion may require.
