## TURKISH LIGHTHOUSE DUES.

*Board of Trade, Whitehall,  
June 29, 1858.*

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Constantinople, notifying that the collection of the fixed Turkish lighthouse dues on all steamers and sailing ships of Friendly Powers, passing through the Straits of the Dardanelles and the Bosphorus, was to commence on the 1<sup>st</sup> June instant, and that, should any masters object to the payment of these dues, the quarantine authorities would not visé their bills of health.

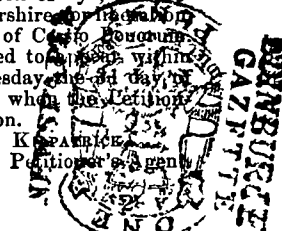
