ALTERATION OF POLLING PLACES.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, in terms of the Act 16 Vict., cap. 28, that a Petition has been presented to the Sheriff of Haddington and Berwick, by certain Voters in the County of Berwick, praying for an increase and alteration of the Polling Places in the said County; by the appointment of the Town of Coldstream as a Polling Place for the Registered Voters in the Parishes of Coldstream, Ladykirk, and Swinton; and of the Town or Village of Earlstoun as a Polling Place for the Registered Voters in the Parishes of Earlstoun, Legerwood, Mertoun, and Nenthorn; and that the said Sheriff, with the consent of Her Majesty's Advocate for Scotland, will make the increase and alteration of Polling Places prayed for, failing any valid objections being made thereto.

INTIMATION is Hereby Given, that ARCHIBALD CAMPBELL, Esquire of Glendaruel, Heir of Entail in possession of the Entailed Estate of GLENDARUEL, in the County of Argyll, has presented a Petition to the Court of Session (Second Division—Junior Lord Ordinary—Mr Shield, Clerk,) in terms of the Act 11th and 12th Victoria, chapter 36, entitled 'An Act for the Amendment of the Law of Entail in Scotland,' and of the Act 16th and 17th Victoria, chapter 94, entitled 'An Act to extend the Benefit of the Act of the 11th and 12th years of Her present Majesty for the Amendment of the Law of Entail in Scotland,' praying their Lordships to authorise the Petitioner to execute over the said Entailed Lands and Estate a BOND of ANNUALRENT or BONDS of ANNUALRENT, in ordinary form, binding himself, and his Heirs of Tailzie in the said Lands and Estate, to make payment of an Annualrent during the period of his own life, and twenty-five years thereafter, such Annualrent during the period of his own life not exceeding the legal interest of the sum of L.2,003 : 12 : 7½, (being the amount of the sum of L.368 : 3 : 10½, contained in a decree of declarator in the Petitioner's favour obtained in the Sheriff-Court of Argyleshire, and dated 16th February 1835, and three-fourths of the sum of L.2,180, 11s. 9d. expended on Improvements on the said Entailed Estate, prior to 14th August 1848,) and during the twenty-five years after his decease, not exceeding the rate of L.7, 2s. for every L.100 of the said sum of L.2,003, 12s. 7½d.; and also to execute over said Lands and Estate another Bond of Annualrent, or Bonds of Annualrent in ordinary form, binding himself and his Heirs of Tailzie in said Lands and Estate, to make payment of an Annualrent during the period of twenty-five years from and after the date of the

decree or finding to be pronounced in said application, or during such part of said period of twenty-five years as shall remain unexpired at the date of the said Bond or Bonds, such Annualrent not exceeding the sum of L.7 : 2s. for every L.100 of the sum of L.873 : 8 : 8, (being the sum expended on Improvements on said Entailed Estate subsequently to the said 14th August 1848); or otherwise, in the option of the Petitioner, to grant warrant to and authorise him to execute over the said Entailed Lands and Estate, exclusive of the Mansion-house, Offices, and Policies thereof, in favour of any Creditor advancing the amount of two-third parts of the foresaid sums of L.2,003, 12s. 7½d., and L.873, 8s. 8d., a Bond and Disposition in security, or Bonds and Dispositions in security, in ordinary form, for the amount so advanced, with the due and legal interest thereof, from the date of such advance till repaid, and with corresponding penalties: On which Petition Lord Curriehill, as Lord Ordinary officiating on the Bills, has pronounced the following Interlocutor:—*25th August 1858.*—'The Lord Ordinary officiating on the Bills appoints this Petition to be intimated on the Walls and in the Minute-Book for fourteen days, and advertised in the Edinburgh Gazette and other Newspapers mentioned in the Petition, in terms of the Statute; and further, grants warrant for serving the same on the persons mentioned in the prayer thereof, in terms of the Act of Sederunt; and ordains them to lodge Answers thereto, if so advised, within fourteen days from the date of service if within Scotland, and sixty days if furth thereof.'
