INTIMATION is Hereby Given, that the Right Honourable GODFREY WILLIAM WENTWORTH, LORD MACDONALD, Heir of Entail in possession of the Entailed Lands and Estate of MACDONALD and Others, lying within the Lordship of the Isles, and Sheriffdom of Inverness, has presented a Petition to the Court of Session, (Second Division, Junior Lord Ordinary, Mr Bringlee, Clerk,) in terms of the Act 11th and 12th Victoria, chapter 36, intituled 'An Act for the Amendment of the Law of Entail in Scotland,' and of the Act 16th and 17th Victoria, chapter 94, intituled 'An Act to extend the benefits of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty for the Amendment of the Law of Entail in Scotland,' for authority to grant to the Chairmen of the Parochial Boards of the Parishes of Portree, Sleat, Strath, Snizort, Kilmuir, Duirinish, and Bracadale, or to other parties representing said Boards, a Feu of part of the said Entailed Lands and Estate of Macdonald, consisting of a Piece of Ground in the Grazing of Shullishadder, and Parish of Portree, lying to the west of the Portree Woollen Manufactory, and extending to one hundred yards square, Imperial measure, at a yearly feu-duty of L.2 sterling, of which a triplicand shall be payable every twentieth year;—and to execute, at the sight of the Court, such Feu-charter or other Feu-right as shall be necessary:—On which Petition Lord Mackenzie, Lord Ordinary on the Bills, has pronounced the following Interlocutor:—'Edinburgh, 11th April 1860.—The Lord Ordinary on the Bills appoints this Petition to be intimated on the Walls and in the Minute-Book for fourteen days, and advertised in the Edinburgh Gazette, North British Advertiser, and Inverness Courier, in terms of the Statute: Farther, grants warrant for serving the same on Somerled James Brudenell Macdonald, designed in the Petition, in terms of the Act of Sederunt; and ordains him to lodge Answers thereto, if so advised, within fourteen days from the date of service, if within Scotland, and sixty days if furth thereof.
