A DESPATCH, dated July 24th, of which the following is an Extract, has been received by Lord John Russell from Lord Bloomfield, G.C.B., Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Prussia :—

I have the honour to inform your Lordship that Her Royal Highness the Princess Frederick William of Prussia, Princess Royal of Great Britain and Ireland, was safely delivered of a Daughter, at the New Palace, at Potsdam, at ten minutes past Eight o'clock this Morning.
