ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning on Monday next, the 27th instant, for Her late Imperial Highness The Grand Duchess Anne of Russia, Aunt to Her Majesty The Queen and to His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, and Sister to Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Kent; viz.:—

The Ladies to wear black Silk, fringed or plain Linen, white Gloves, Necklaces, and Ear-rings, black or white Shoes, Fans, and Tippets.

The Gentlemen to wear Black full-trimmed, fringed or plain Linen, black Swords and Buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Monday, the 3d day of September next; viz.:—

The Ladies to wear black Silk or Velvet, coloured Ribbons, Faus and Tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver Stuffs, with black Ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black Coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver Stuff Waistcoats, full-trimmed, coloured Swords and Buckles.

And on Monday the 10th of September next the Court to go out of Mourning.
