Revolving Light near Varne Shoal.

THE Corporation of the Trinity House of London has given notice, (in pursuance of their advertisement dated the 24th February last,) that a light-vessel has been placed near the west end of the Varne Shoal, in Dover Strait, and that a light is now exhibited therefrom, and will be so continued from sunset to sunrise.

The light is a quick revolving red light, elevated 38 feet above the level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 10 miles.
