AN ACT TO REGULATE AND AMEND THE LAW
RESPECTING
THE SALMON FISHERIES OF SCOTLAND."

WE, the Commissioners appointed under the said Act, and empowered thereby "To fix for the purposes of this Act the Limits of every District, and the portions of the Sea Coast adjoining to the Mouth or Estuary of any River to be included in such District"—and "To fix for the purposes of this Act, a point on each River (including the Estuary thereof) below which, the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Lower Proprietors, and above which, the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Upper Proprietors"—do hereby fix and determine—

- 1st. That the limits of the District of the River YTHAN shall be on the North, the boundary between the Parishes of Peterhead and Cruden,—on the South, the northern boundary of the Fishings of Menie; and that the District shall consist of the portions of the Sea Coast, and the Estuary, and the River contained between the said points.
- 2nd. That the point below which the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Lower Proprietors, and above which the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Upper Proprietors, shall be the old ford known as Ellis Ford, on the old road, now unused, from Peterhead to Aberdeen.

WE, the Commissioners appointed under the said Act, and empowered thereby "To fix for the purposes of this Act the Limits of every District, and the portions of the Sea Coast adjoining to the Mouth or Estuary of any River to be included in such District"—and "To fix for the purposes of this Act, a point on each River (including the Estuary thereof) below which, the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Lower Proprietors, and above which, the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Upper Proprietors"—do hereby fix and determine—

- 1st. That the limits of the District of the River NORTH ESK shall be on the North, the boundary between the Parishes of Bervie and Benholm,—on the South, the March between the Properties of Montrose and of Charlton; and that the District shall consist of the portions of the Sea Coast, and the Estuary, and the River contained between the said points.
- 2nd. That the point below which the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Lower Proprietors, and above which the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Upper Proprietors, shall be a line to be drawn across the Ford above Fluke Hole, from the East end of the Land Embankment on the right side of the River, to the Pigeon House under Kirkside Plantation, on the left side of the River.

"AN ACT TO REGULATE AND AMEND THE LAW
RESPECTING
THE SALMON FISHERIES OF SCOTLAND."

WE, the Commissioners appointed under the said Act, and empowered thereby "To fix for the purposes of this Act the Limits of every District, and the portions of the Sea Coast adjoining to the Mouth or Estuary of any River to be included in such District"—and "To fix for the purposes of this Act, a point on each River (including the Estuary thereof) below which, the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Lower Proprietors, and above which, the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Upper Proprietors"—do hereby fix and determine—

- 1st. That the limits of the District of the River DON shall be on the North, the Northern Boundary of the Fishings of Menie; and on the South, the March Stone heretofore placed for the purpose of dividing the Coast Fishings of the Dee and Don Rivers; and that the District shall consist of the portions of the Sea Coast, and the Estuary, and the River contained between the said points.
- 2nd. That the point below which the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Lower Proprietors, and above which the Proprietors of Fisheries shall be Upper Proprietors, shall be a line to be drawn at right angles with the River, from the outlet of the Tail Lade of the Mill on the left bank, immediately below Seaton House.
