(No. 44.)—CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.—TABLE BAY.

Green Light on the Breakwater.

The Colonial Government at the Cape of Good Hope has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of November 1863, a light will be established on the staging forming the outer arm of the works now in progress in Table Bay.

The light will be a fixed green light, visible when bearing from south round by west to north. It will be placed at an elevation of 25 feet above high water, but the distance at which it will be seen is not given.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by

lenses of the sixth order.

The light is intended to guide vessels entering Table Bay from a too close proximity to the breakwater, and will be shifted outwards as the works proceed. It will not be seen until vessels are eastward of Mouille Point light.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 29° 45′ West, in 1863.]
