The Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Lima, reporting that a new law of that Republic establishes that on the 1st January next no other coin will be received at the Public Offices in Peru, but National Coin, and in this money all payments are to be made. Hitherto Bolivian Coin, which had currency in Peru, has been admitted in all public establishments. The Government is also to withdraw from circulation all money not decimal, and this is to be converted into decimal currency.

The National Gold Coin is to have no official value, but will be received at Government Offices, and paid out of them according to the current price.
