

thence up the said tributary burn to the west end of the dam attached to the said mill, and from the west end of the said dam, in a south-westerly direction, to the nearest point of the boundary between the counties of Perth and Forfar, and thence southward along that boundary to the Frith of Tay; and the said Frith of Tay on the south; and also the district comprised within an area of 1000 yards beyond the before-defined boundaries on all sides excepting the side on which these limits are bounded by the Frith of Tay, and except the portions, if there be any, beyond the boundary of the County of Forfar, or within such smaller limits as may be defined in the Bill; which limits above-mentioned, or to be defined, shall be the whole limits of supply; and to provide that the limits of compulsory supply shall comprise and include the Parliamentary Burgh of Dundee, and also the said adjacent Burgh of Broughty Ferry, and all the Lands which lie between the two Burghs and lie between the Turnpike Road between Dundee and Arbroath, which shall be the North boundary, and the Frith of Tay, which shall be the boundary on the South, and the limits of compulsory supply shall also comprise and include the lands and places adjacent, within 800 yards beyond the limits of compulsory supply already named, on every side thereof, except the side on which the boundary is the Frith of Tay; or such smaller limits as may be defined in the Bill; to provide for the supply of Water for domestic purposes within the limits of compulsory supply, in the manner and subject to the provisions to be specified in the Bill; to make such provisions as may be deemed necessary, suitable or expedient in reference to the introduction of Water into all houses within the limits of compulsory supply, and to empower the Commissioners to supply Water for domestic purposes to any person or persons beyond the limits of compulsory supply, but within the whole limits of supply, and for public wells, fountains, baths, and washing houses, public buildings, factories, boilers, steam engines and machinery, railways, harbours, and shipping, and for extinguishing fires, cleansing streets, sewers, and drains, and for other purposes not domestic within the whole limits of supply, and to make all such provisions in the premises as may be suitable.

To empower the Commissioners, for and in respect of the supply of Water, or use thereof, and the other purposes of the Bill, to levy the existing rates, rents, and charges authorised by the said Act, 1 Vict., cap. 126, and by the fore-said several Acts of the Company, or any of them, or to alter or repeal, in whole or in part, such existing rates, rents, and charges, and to authorise the Commissioners to levy such existing or altered or new or additional rates, rents, and charges from the owners and occupiers, both or either of them, of all lands and heritages of whatever description within the limits before mentioned, or to be defined in the Bill as the whole limits of supply, and from all others receiving a supply of Water, and for such supply to the Harbour of Dundee and shipping frequenting the same; and also to impose and levy Domestic Water Rates or Assessments and Public Water Rates or Assessments on and from the owners and occupiers, both or either of them, of all lands and heritages of whatever description, within the limits before mentioned, or to be defined in the

Bill as the limits of compulsory supply; and to confer, vary, and extinguish exemptions from payment of the said several rates, rents, charges and assessments.

To make provision for regulating the supply and preventing the waste or misuse of Water, and for the construction of Public Fountains and discontinuance of existing Public Wells, or some of them; to authorise the Commissioners to make Bye-Laws, with a view the better to carry out the provisions of the Bill; to make provision for a Sinking Fund and a Reserve Fund; as also wholly or partially to incorporate with the said Bill, and to extend to the undertaking of the Commissioners, or such parts thereof as shall be defined by the said Bill, the provisions or some of them, of "The Companies' Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act 1845," "The Railways Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act 1860," "The Waterworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1863," and "The Commissioners' Clauses Act 1847," or some of them.

To empower the Commissioners to borrow on mortgage or bond on the security of the Works and others to be transferred or acquired by or under the said Bill, or on any of them, and of the Rates or Assessments, Rents or Charges, which, under the powers of the said Bill, may become leviable by them, or any of such Rates or Assessments, Rents or Charges, or by cash credit, such sums of money as may be required for the purposes of carrying the objects and provisions of the said intended Bill into effect, and to convert the sums so borrowed into funded debt or debenture stock.

To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges connected with the foresaid Works, undertaking, and property of the Commissioners under said Act, 1 Vict., c. 126, Corporation and Company respectively, or conferred by or in relation to any of the provisions of the said Act, 1 Vict., c. 126, or the several Acts of the Company before mentioned, which it may be considered expedient to vary or extinguish, and to confer new powers, rights, and privileges.

And all powers will be taken by the said Bill which shall be calculated to further the ends and objects of providing for the whole limits of supply water for all domestic, public, police, cleansing, sanitary, manufacturing, and shipping purposes, and for every other purpose to which the same may be applied.
