

springs, and other property, and all other rights and privileges which might in any manner interfere with any of the purposes of the said Bill, and to confer all rights and privileges which may be necessary or expedient for effecting the said purposes or in relation thereto; as also to authorise and regulate the prosecution, by the Clerk to the Commissioners, of all offenders against the Provisions of the last-mentioned Act and of the said Bill, and of the Acts incorporated with the said Act and Bill, or against the bye-laws of the Commissioners, before the Sheriff or any one or more of the Justices of the Peace of the County of Dumbarton.

And it is also intended by the said Bill to provide for the division of the Burgh of Dumbarton into wards, for the purpose of Parliamentary and Municipal elections, and for fixing the number and boundaries of the wards, and the apportionment of the Town Councillors to the wards, and for the appointment of polling places for such elections.

And for the purposes aforesaid it is intended by the said Bill to amend "The Dumbarton Water Works Reclamation and Municipal Extension Act, 1857," or to repeal and re-enact or consolidate the enactments thereof with such amendments as may be necessary or expedient; and to incorporate with the said Bill "The Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860," and "The Water Works Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863," or some of the provisions of those Acts.

And Notice is Further Given, That plans and sections describing the lines, situation, and levels of the said intended Works, and the brooks and streams intended to be directly diverted into the said Works, and the lands, houses and other property through which the said Works are intended to be made, and within the limits of deviation as defined upon the said plans, or which may be required to be taken under the powers of the said Bill, together with a book of reference to the said plans, containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and occupiers of such lands, houses, and property, and a copy of this Notice, as published in the Edinburgh Gazette, will, on or before the 30th day of November instant, be deposited for public inspection in the office at Dumbarton of the principal Sheriff Clerk of the county of Dumbarton, and that a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and book of reference as relates to each of the parishes of Old or West Kilpatrick and Dumbarton, and to the Royal Burgh of Dumbarton, respectively, with a copy of this Notice, as published in the Edinburgh Gazette, will, on or before the said 30th day of November instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Schoolmaster, or if there be no Schoolmaster, with the Session-clerk of each such parish, at his usual place of abode, and with the Town Clerk of the said Royal Burgh, at his office in Dumbarton.

GLASGOW GAS LIGHT COMPANY.

(Power to Raise Additional Money; Reserve Fund; Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is Hereby Given, That application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the ensuing Session, for leave to bring in a Bill for the following purposes, or some of them—that is to say—

To enable the Glasgow Gas Light Company (hereinafter called The Company) to raise a further Sum or further Sums of Money, by the Creation and Issue of New Ordinary Shares or Stock, or New Preference Shares or Stock, in their Undertaking, and by borrowing on the security of the Works, Property, and revenue of the Company, or in such other manner as shall be provided by the said Bill, for the purpose of enlarging their Works, and of giving an increased and extended supply within the district in which the Company are authorised to supply Gas, and of providing, laying down, and maintaining additional Mains, Pipes, Conduits, and other Works and conveniences for giving such increased and extended supply, and for the purposes generally of their undertaking, and to make further provisions as to, and, if thought expedient, to alter and increase the reserve fund which the Company are authorised to set aside, and to alter and regulate the purposes to which such reserve fund is to be applied, and to provide for the application of certain of the monies which the Company have raised, or are entitled or will by the proposed Bill be entitled to raise, to such reserve fund; and it is intended by the said Bill to enable the Company to levy Rates, Rents, and Charges, and to alter existing Rates, Rents, and Charges for the supply of Gas and for the use of Meters and other conveniences furnished by the Company, and to confer, vary, and extinguish exemptions from the payment of Rates, Rents, and Charges; and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which might impede or interfere with any of the objects aforesaid, and to confer other rights and privileges.

And for these and other purposes it is intended by the said Bill to amend, in whole or in part, the following local Acts relating to the Company, namely, 57 George III., Chapter 41, 3 George IV., Chapter 80, 6 George IV., Chapter 35, 7 George IV., Chapter 38, 20 and 21 Victoria, Chapter 35, and 26 Victoria, Chapter 7, or to repeal the said Acts, and to consolidate and re-enact the provisions thereof, with such amendments thereon as may be considered expedient; as also, to incorporate with the said Bill "The Companies Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863," and "The Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847," or some of the provisions of those Acts.

Printed Copies of the said Bill, as proposed to be introduced into Parliament, will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 23d day of December next.
