ELECTION OF THE CHANCELLOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF EDINBURGH.

IT is Hereby Intimated that a Meeting of the General Council of the University of Edinburgh having been held according to Statute and Ordinance, on the 30th day of October last, at which The RIGHT HONOURABLE JOHN INGLIS, LORD JUSTICE-GENERAL, and The RIGHT HONOURABLE WILLIAM EWART GLADSTONE, were duly nominated as Candidates for the vacant Office of CHANCELLOR of the University, and a Poll having been demanded, Voting-papers were issued by the Registrar to all Members of the General Council residing at the time in the United Kingdom: That the votes delivered to the Registrar have been this day summed up by him, conformably with the provisions of the Ordinances of the late Universities' (Scotland) Commissioners, Ord. XI., Sec. 9, in presence of John Hope Finlay, W.S., duly authorised by the Proposer of the Lord Justice-General, and of J. P. Coldstream, W.S., by the Proposer of the Right Honourable W. E.
