PORTOBELLO PIER.

(Incorporation of Company; Power to Construct a Pier at Portobello; Compulsory Purchase of Lands; Power to Levy Tolls; and other Purposes.)

NOTICE is Hereby Given, That application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill to incorporate a Company (hereinafter called "The Company;") and to enable the Company to Make and Maintain the Pier and Works hereinafter mentioned, or some of them, that is to say:—

A Pier, Jetty, and Landing Place, with all proper Works, Approaches, Toll-Houses, Toll-Gates, and other Works and conveniences connected therewith, for Embarking and Landing of Passengers, Goods, and Merchandise, and for other purposes, such Pier to commence at a point on the Foreshore of the Firth of Forth Seventy-Five Feet North-West of the North Corner of the Portobello Baths, situate at the foot of Bath Street, in the Town of Portobello, Parish of Duddingston, and County of Edinburgh, and extending from such point into the Sea in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 1250 Feet, and to terminate there; all which Pier and Works will be in the Parish of Duddingston and County of Edinburgh, and the Bed or Soil of the Firth of Forth, in or adjacent to said Parish of Duddingston.

And it is also proposed by the said Bill to confer on the Company powers to effect the objects and purposes following, or some of them, that is to say:—

To empower the Company to deviate in the construction of the said proposed Pier and Works from the lines and levels delineated on the plans and sections intended to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned, to such an extent as will be defined in the said plans and provided by the said Bill.

To purchase by compulsion or agreement all such Lands, Houses, and Buildings as may be required for the construction of such Pier and Works, or for any other purpose of the Bill.

To stop up, alter, or divert, whether temporarily or permanently, for any of the purposes of the Bill, all Esplanades, Roads, Paths, and Highways, which it may be necessary or convenient to stop up, alter, or divert, for the purposes of the Bill, and to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges in any manner connected with any Lands, Houses, or Buildings, to be purchased or acquired by the Company, or any Road, Path, Highway, Sewer, Main-pipe, or Work, to be stopped up, altered, or diverted as aforesaid, which would in any manner impede or interfere with the construction of the said Pier and Works, or with the purposes of the Bill.

To levy Tolls, Rates, and Duties for the use of the said Pier and Works; to confer, vary, or

extinguish exemptions from the Payment of Tolls, Rates, and Duties; and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights and privileges.

To incorporate with the Bill all or some of the provisions of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860," "The Railways Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," "The Railways Clauses Act, 1863," and "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," and such other powers and provisions as may be deemed necessary.

And Notice is Hereby Further Given, That Duplicate Plans and Sections of the said Pier and Works, and of the Lands to be taken for the purposes thereof, together with a Book of Reference to such Plans, and a Copy of this Notice, as published in the *Edinburgh Gazette*, will, on or before the 30th day of November current, be deposited with the Sheriff-Clerk of the County of Edinburgh, at his Office at Edinburgh, and with the Schoolmaster, or, if there be no Schoolmaster, with the Session-Clerk of the said Parish of Duddingston, at his Residence.

Printed Copies of the said Bill will, on or before the 23d day of December next, be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
