OPIES and extracts from letters received by Vice Admiral Rainer from the feveral Captains and Commanders of his Majesty's ships and vessels in the East Indies, from the 25th October 1799, to the 28th; September 1800, with accounts of their respective captures, &cc.

Copy of a Letter from Captain WM. HILLS, of his Majesty's Ship Orpheus, dated La Copong, the Streights of Banca, the 25th Oct. 1799.

SIR,

I HAVE the pleasure to inform you, that on my passage from Ternate to the Streights of Banca, I yesterday discovered two fail off Tagolanda, which I chased at one P. M. At three it fell calm, all the hoats were hoisted out to tow the ship, and every exertion made to get up with them. On a breeze springing up at five o'clock, we cast off all our boats, but was not able to get alongside of them until a quarter before nine o'clock, when we brought them to a close action on each bow, which continued about a quarter of an hour, when they both struck their colours. They proved the Zeevraght and Zeelast, the one a brig and the other a large panchallang, each mounting 22 guns of different calibres, from Macasser, loaded with rice, powder, shot, gun carriages, and stores from Ternate. During the action I lost one of my best seamen, killed in the maintop, and five wounded, among the latter is the first Lieutenant Hodg, kins, who received a musquet ball through his right arm; his conduct on this, as on every one would be the conduct of this, as on every one would be the conduct of the co

I had great pleasure in obferving the zeal of all the officers and men on this occasion, as I have done several times since my arrival at these Islands, which justly entitled them to my thanks.

Extract of a Letter from Captain George Astle, of his Majesty's ship La Virginie, dated Amboyna, the 20th May 1800, to Vice-Admiral Rainier, Commander in Chief, &c.

I BEG leave to acquaint you, that I arrived here on 6th May.

I enclose a list of vessels captured on my pasfage, which are arrived at Amboyna.

On the 26th April, in lat. I deg. 10 min. S. long. 126 deg. 25 min. E. fell in with and captured the following vessels, under Dut:h colours, from the island of Java, bound to Ternate, viz.

Vrow Helena, (ship.) mounting eight fix-pound carriage guns and four swivels, manned with forty men.

Brig Helena, mounting twelve fix-pound guns, man-

ned with twenty men.

Brig Braack, mounting ten four-pound guns, manned with twelve men.

The Three latter vessels laden with Annual sup-

plies for the garrison on the island of Ternate, and had on board, exclusive of their cargoes, specie to the amount of seventeen thousand nine hundred and fortythree Spanish dollars.
