Board of Trade, Whitehall, January 20, 1870.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, copies of two Decrees issued by the French Government respecting the temporary importation of cast iron and cotton tissues.

The following are the Articles of these Decrees, which were published on 9th January instant:—

I. ART. 1. Cast iron shall continue to be admitted under the system of temporary admissions which was instituted by the Decree of 15th February 1862.

Cast pig iron, however, can only be imported under this system for the manufacture of cast

wares.

ART. 2. Iron and other metals enumerated in Art. 1 of the Decree of 15th February 1862 must be conveyed to the factories authorised to make use of them.

The Custom-house officers will take such measures as are necessary to ensure the arrival of these products at their destination.

ART. 3. Charcoal-iron cannot be represented upon re-exportation by an equivalent of articles manufactured from coke-iron.

ART. 4. The credit account allowed on importation will only be opened at the recommendation of the Consulting Committee of Arts and Manufactures, charged with the duty of examining into the relation which exists between the material imported and the products exported.

ART. 5. All the provisions of the Decree of 15th February 1862, which are not opposed to the present Decree, are to remain in force.

ART. 6. The importation credit accounts already opened will remain in force for six months from the date of the present Decree, under the conditions laid down in the foregoing Articles.

II. ART. 1. Four months from the date of the present Decree, tissues of cotton, pure or mixed, shall cease to be admitted under the system of temporary admissions.

#### SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

In pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," Notice is Hereby Given that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the Next of Kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased Soldiers named in the List which is published with this Notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to the "Under Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldiers' Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the dates and places of the Soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his Regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars, furnished by the applicant, not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased Soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then, within three calendar months, the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the Clergyman, or one of the Churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace. The applicant's address, with the name of the post-town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further Lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the Notice in which the deceased Soldier's name appeared.
