PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS day the Right Hon. Philip Earl of Hardwicke, and the Right Hon. George Legge, commonly called Viscount Lewisham, were, by his Majesty's command, sworn of his Majesty's Most Hon. Privy Council, and took their places at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty in Council was this day pleased to declare the Right Hon. Philip Earl of Hardwicke, Lieutenant General and General Governor of that part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

Favorite, at sea, March 13.

I BEG leave to acquaint you, that at half-past ten yesterday morning, I chased a lugger from under Scarborough, and continued so till ten P. M. when I lost sight of her ; I then saw a sail to windward, to which I also gave chase, and captured ; she proves to be L'Optimiste French schooner privateer of Dunkirk (sailed from thence seven days) mounting fourteen carriage guns, manned with forty-seven men, commanded by Jean Baptiste Corenwinder.
