

and Midchingle Salmon Fishings respectively, on the other hand, to enter into Agreements as to the purchase and sale of the said rights of Salmon Fishing in the Sea and in the River Dee, and to confirm, if thought fit, any Agreement or Agreements already or hereafter to be entered into, with reference thereto.

To enable the Commissioners, after the purchase of such Fishings as aforesaid, to hold, or to sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of, the same in such manner and on such terms and conditions, and in the case of a lease, for such period, as may be deemed most expedient for the interests of the Harbour Trust.

To authorise the Commissioners to borrow, and from time to time to re-borrow Money for the purchase of the said Fishings or some of them, or other purposes of the said Bill relative to the said Fishings, or any of such purposes, on Mortgage, Bond, Annuity, Cash Credit, or otherwise, and to apply for these purposes the funds and moneys under their control, and to charge moneys borrowed on their corporate estates and revenues and rents belonging to them, and on the property to be purchased under the powers of the Bill, and the revenues, rents, and charges to arise or to be levied or made under the Bill, and if expedient to fund the said debt so to be created.

To extend the provisions of Section 39 of "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," or to make other similar provisions, with reference to the account to be given by persons shipping goods on board vessels lying within the limits of the Port and Harbour of Aberdeen, and to apply such provisions, or some of them, to goods intended to be unshipped within the same limits, and to provide that the enactments contained in Sections 37 and 38 of "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," or some of them, shall not apply to the Port and Harbour, or to goods intended to be unshipped thereat.

For these and other purposes, the Bill will amend, extend, or repeal, so far as necessary, the powers and provisions of "The Aberdeen Harbour Act, 1868," and will restrict, vary, or extinguish any rights or privileges which may interfere with the objects of the Bill, and will confer other rights and privileges.
