THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Note from the Austro-Hungarian Ambassador at this Court, announcing that the Austro-Hungarian Government have created an Hungarian Maritime Prefect, who will reside at the port of Fiume, and whose jurisdiction will extend over all the maritime authorities in the ports of Hungary and Croatia, who up to the present time have been included in the Central Maritime Prefecture of Trieste.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 116.)—SCOTLAND.—WEST COAST.

Alteration in Ardrossan Harbour Light.

The Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses have given Notice that the following alteration has been made in the light at the extremity of the breakwater at Ardrossan.

The fixed red light has been changed to a white flashing light, showing bright two seconds and eclipsed one second.

IRELAND.—SOUTH COAST.

Tide Light, Youghal Harbour.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 78, dated 4th August 1870, respecting the exhibition of a tide light from a window of the tower of Youghal lighthouse :

The Commissioners of Irish lights have just given Notice that the light is now exhibited from *two* hours before high water to *one and a half* hours after high water. The light is a *red* light, visible through an arc of 18 degrees, or from N.E. by N. to N. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

By day a ball will be shown for the same period of time.

ENGLAND.—EAST COAST.—THAMES RIVER.

Alteration in Blyth Buoys, Sea Reach.

The Thames Conservancy has given Notice that, in accordance with the system of buoyage adopted by the Trinity House, the following alteration has been made in the buoys marking the Blyth Sand, Sea Reach :—

West Blyth Buoy is a *nun* buoy, *striped black and white vertically*.

Middle Blyth Buoy is a *can* buoy, *striped black and white vertically*.

East Blyth Buoy is a *nun* buoy, *striped black and white vertically*.

GREENOCK POLICE IMPROVEMENT AND GAS.

Amendment of Greenock Police Acts, 1840 and 1865, and of "The General Police and Improvement (Scotland) Act, 1862." Alteration of time of Meeting of Board of Police for Imposing Assessments. Provisions as to—Procurators Fiscal—Additional Lands for, and Provisions as to, Gunpowder Magazines, Dean of Guild and Dean of Guild Council. Definition of word "Street." Lighting of Common Stairs, Passages, and Private Courts. Taking Over, Curbing, Levelling, &c., of Streets. Inspection, &c., of Dwelling Houses, Rescinding or Altering Deed of 1831 between Water Trustees and Town Council as to Gas Works, and Deed of Concert of 1827 therein referred to. Purchase of Existing Gas Works. Power to Corporation of Greenock to Sell, and Board of Police to Purchase Existing Gas Works. Power to Board of Police to Discontinue Existing Gas Works, and to Sell and Dispose thereof and Existing Gas Lands, and Provisions as to Application of Money to be received therefor. Powers to Board of Police to Maintain Existing Gas Works. To make New Gas Works. To acquire Lands by Compulsion or Agreement for that purpose and the other purposes of the Bill. To Construct Embankment, and other Works at Island of Inchgreen. Reclamation of Land there. Compulsory Purchase of Lands to Manufacture and Supply Gas in Greenock and the Neighbourhood thereof. To Levy Rates, Rents, and Charges for such Supply, and to alter Existing Rates, Rents, and Charges. To Levy Special Rates and Assessments for the purposes of the Bill, and to alter Existing Rates and Assessments. To Borrow Money and to Charge the same on their Estates and Revenues, and on Rates, Rents and Assessments now or hereafter Leviable, or which may arise under the Bill, and on the Property for the time being belonging to them. Payment of Interest. Incorporation of General Acts. Repeal or Amendment of Acts, and other Purposes.

NOTICE is Hereby Given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session by the Board of Police of Greenock (hereinafter called "the Board") incorporated by and acting under the powers and provisions of "The Greenock Police and Improvement Act, 1865" (hereinafter called "the Act of 1865") for leave to bring in a Bill for the following, or some of the following, among other purposes. That is to say,—

First.—To alter, amend, extend and enlarge the powers and provisions, or some of the powers and provisions of the Act of 1865, and the unrepealed clauses and provisions of the Act (local and personal) 3d Victoria, chapter 27, intituled, "An Act for the further Improvement of the Town of Greenock, for better lighting and supplying the same with water, for regulating the Police thereof, and for other purposes connected therewith" (which Act is hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1840), or otherwise to repeal the said Acts or either of them or some portion of both or either of them, and to make further and other

provisions, and to confer further and other powers instead thereof.

Second.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of the 40th section of the Act of 1865, and to provide that the assessments thereby authorised, shall be imposed at the monthly meeting of the Board, to be held on the Third Tuesday in September in every year, or on such other days as the Bill may define, instead of the Third Tuesday in June, as directed by the said Act.

Third.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of the 64th, 65th, and 66th sections of the Act of 1865, or one or more of those sections, and to provide for the appointment of one or more Procurators Fiscal for the purposes of the said Act and of the Bill, in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Bill may define.

Fourth.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of the 118th section of the Act of 1865, and to enable and authorise the Board to purchase by agreement, but not compulsorily, certain lands situate on the south-west part of a field, forming a portion of the Bow Farm, now in the occupation of Robert Laird, and belonging to Sir Michael Robert Shaw Stewart, Baronet, in the West Parish of Greenock or Parish of Greenock, and County of Renfrew, and to provide and maintain convenient premises to be used as a Magazine for Gunpowder and Fireworks upon those lands, in addition to the lands and places specified in the said section, and to confer on the Board the same powers and privileges with respect to the conveyance and storage of, and otherwise dealing with, Gunpowder, in connection with the lands so to be purchased as they now possess under the Act of 1865, with respect to the Island of Inchgreen and Fort Matilda, and to repeal, alter, or amend the prohibition contained in the said section, *videlicet*, that no Magazine shall be built on any sites other than those specified in that section, unless in pursuance of a license granted as therein provided, and to make further and other provisions with reference to providing and maintaining Magazines for Gunpowder and Fireworks, and to confer further powers on the Board in relation thereto.

Fifth.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of sections 151, 152, 156, 157, 158, 159, 160, and 161 of the Act of 1865, or one or more of those sections, and the 408th section of the General Police and Improvement (Scotland) Act, 1862, so far as incorporated in the Act of 1865, and to provide that the party to be chosen and designated to be Dean of Guild, as provided by the 151st section of the Act of 1865, need not be one of the Bailies of the town of Greenock, and to repeal, alter, or amend sections 157 and 159 of the Act of 1865, with reference to the Council of the Dean of Guild, and to authorise the Dean of Guild to act without the concurrence or assistance of his said Council, or with the concurrence or assistance of one or more of his said Council, and to amend the provisions as to the quorum of the said Council, and to make such other provisions with respect to the said Dean and Council as the Bill may define.

Sixth.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of section 2 of the Act of 1865, and the interpretation thereby given to the word "street," and to provide that the word "street," as used in the said Act, shall have the meaning attached to that word by the "General Police and Improvement (Scotland)

Act, 1862," or as may be attached to that word by the Bill.

Seventh.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of sections 130 and 131 of the General Police and Improvement (Scotland) Act, 1862, so far as incorporated with the Act of 1865, or either of those sections, and to make further and other provisions and regulations as to the lighting of common stairs, passages, and private courts, and with respect to the liability for, and the recovery of, the expenses thereof.

Eighth.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of sections 165 to 200, both inclusive, of the Act of 1865, or any one or more of those sections, and to make further and other provisions with respect to streets within the limits of the Act, and especially to provide that the Board shall be entitled, before taking over and maintaining any streets as public streets, to require the same to be drained, paved, curbed and levelled as they may direct; and further, to provide that the Board may proceed to do the acts specified in section 191 of the Act of 1865 without any petition from the proprietors as therein provided.

Ninth.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of section 279 of the Act of 1865, and to authorize the Board, from time to time, by persons to be appointed by them, to enter the dwelling-houses specified in said section for the purpose of ascertaining that the provisions of the said section are being complied with.

Tenth.—To rescind and annul, or to alter, amend, or vary a Deed of Agreement dated the 22d day of February, 1831, and registered in the Books of Council and Session at Edinburgh, the 7th day of March, 1831, and made between John Fairrie and Robert Baine, Bailies; Robert Steele, Treasurer; James Scott, John Ker, Robert Lusk, Robert Kerr, James Macnaught and John Miller, Councillors of the Burgh of Barony of Greenock, and as such, Trustees for bringing Water into, Paving, Lighting, Cleansing, and Watching the said Town, and Archibald King, Archibald Buchanan, Walter Baine, Agnew Crawford, Archibald Black, John Kerr, John Rodger, Junior, and Hugh Mitchell, Trustees elected by the Feuars and Householders for the aforesaid purposes, conform to Act of Parliament, commonly called Trustees on the Water Fund, on the one part, and the said John Fairrie and Robert Baine, Robert Steele, James Scott, John Ker, Robert Lusk, Robert Kerr, James Macnaught, and John Miller, as Bailies, Treasurer, and Councillors, foresaid, and acting as such on behalf of the community, on the other part (hereinafter referred to as the Agreement of 1831), and the Deed of Concert therein recited and referred to, entered into by the subscribers to the fund for erecting Gas Works in Greenock, with consent, as therein mentioned, dated the 27th day of September, 1827.

Eleventh.—To alter and amend, or to repeal and make other provisions in lieu of, the 17th section of the Act of 1865, and particularly in so far as the same provides that the Agreement of 1831 shall be good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes, and may be enforced by or against the Board to the same extent and effect that it might have been enforced by or against the Trustees for carrying into effect the Act of 1840, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

Twelfth.—To authorise and empower the Board to purchase and hold, and the Provost, Bailies, and Town Council of the Town or Burgh of

Greenock (hereinafter referred to as the Corporation), and any other body, corporation, or individual having any interest, either under the Agreement of 1831 or the before-mentioned Deed of Concert or otherwise, to sell to the Board by agreement all their right, title, estate, and interest in, and to the Gas Works, lands, pipes, and apparatus at present vested in them, by which Gas Works (hereinafter described) the said Burgh and Town of Greenock, in the County of Renfrew, and its neighbourhood, are now supplied with Gas, and also to carry into effect all or any of the powers and provisions of the Bill.

Thirteenth.—To enable the Corporation to sell and transfer to the Board, and to enable the Board to purchase, acquire, and hold the said Gas Works, pipes and apparatus, and all rights and privileges, and the benefit of all contracts and agreements connected therewith, and the lands and premises hereinafter described, on which the said Gas Works have been erected (and which lands and premises are hereinafter referred to as the existing gas lands), and until the completion of such sale and transfer, or otherwise to authorise and empower the Corporation and all others, now entitled under the agreement of 1831, or otherwise, to continue to supply Gas, and to exercise all such powers, rights, and privileges in connection with, and for the purposes of, such supply as may be authorised by the Bill, and to confirm by the Bill any agreement or arrangement already made, or hereafter to be made, for the sale and transfer of the said works, pipes, and apparatus, and the existing Gas lands, or the price or consideration to be paid or made to the Corporation or any other parties for such sale and transfer, or to provide by the Bill for such transfer, and the vesting in the Board of the said works, pipes, apparatus, and other property, and the existing Gas lands and the terms and conditions thereof, and the price or consideration to be paid by the Board.

Fourteenth.—To authorise the Board to maintain and hold, and to alter and improve (but not to extend), the existing Gas Works, within the limits in which the same are now erected, and which limits comprise the lands following, that is to say:—First, that piece or portion of ground in the West Parish of Greenock, or Parish of Greenock and County of Renfrew, situated and lying between and in an area included within the following boundary, that is to say:—A boundary commencing at a point formed by the junction of Laird Street and Crawford Street, proceeding thence along the north-west side of Laird Street for a distance of 101 feet or thereby, then turning north-westwards, at right angles, and proceeding in a straight line for a distance of 143 feet or thereby along the boundary of property belonging to Mrs Robertson and James Weir, then turning, at right angles, in a south-westerly direction, and proceeding in a straight line for a distance of 99 feet or thereby until it joins the line of the north-east side of West Blackhall Street, then turning and proceeding north-westwards along the north-east side of said West Blackhall Street for a distance of 219 feet or thereby, then turning, at right angles, and proceeding north-eastwards in a straight line for a distance of 97 feet or thereby, then turning, at right angles, and proceeding in a straight line in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 6 feet or thereby, then turning, at right angles, and proceeding in a north-easterly direction in a straight line for a

distance of 102 feet or thereby, until it joins the line of the south-west side of Crawford Street, then turning and proceeding along the south-west side of Crawford Street for a distance of 357 feet or thereby until it reaches the junction of that Street with Laird Street, the point at which this description began; and second, that piece or portion of ground occupied by a gas holder and other erections, situated and lying between and in an area bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point formed by the junction of Clarence Street and Laird Street, and proceeding along the north-west side of Laird Street for a distance of 140 feet or thereby, until it reaches the point at which this street joins Kirk Street, then turning and proceeding along the north-east side of Kirk Street for a distance of 167 feet or thereby until it reaches the point at which this street joins Roslin Street, then turning and proceeding along the south-east side of Roslin Street for a distance of 138 feet or thereby until it reaches the point at which this street joins Clarence Street, then turning and proceeding along the south-west side of Clarence Street for a distance of 141 feet or thereby until it reaches the junction of that street with Laird Street, the point at which this description began; both which pieces of ground are situated within the West Parish of Greenock or Parish of Greenock and County of Renfrew, and which lands are in this notice referred to as the existing Gas lands.

Fifteenth.—To authorise the Board, if and when they think fit, to discontinue the manufacture and storage of Gas on the existing Gas lands, and to sell and dispose of the existing Works and existing Gas lands, and to provide for the application of the money to be received therefor.

Sixteenth.—To authorise the Board to make, construct, and maintain the following work, with all necessary and proper walls, piers, drains, sluices, openings, bridges, gates, culverts, carriageways, footways, approaches, and other works and conveniences connected therewith, that is to say, an embankment or sea wall situate wholly in the East Parish of Greenock, or Parish of Greenock, in the county of Renfrew, commencing on the west side of the street 50 feet or thereby wide, leading northwards from the Port-Glasgow Road, along the western boundary of the shipbuilding yard now or formerly belonging to Messrs Lawrence Hill & Co., at a point 578 feet or thereby northwards of the north side of the Port-Glasgow Road, where that road is joined by the west side of the said street, proceeding thence diagonally across the said street in an easterly direction for a distance of 37 feet or thereby, thence diagonally in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 32 feet or thereby, till it joins the east side of the said street, thence proceeding diagonally across and beyond the said street in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 100 feet or thereby, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 32 feet or thereby, to a point on a line drawn in continuation of the west side of that street 690 feet or thereby northwards of the north side of the Port-Glasgow Road, where that road is joined by the west side of the said street, from that point proceeding in a northerly direction, and crossing the eastern end of the Island of Inchgreen, in a straight line drawn in continuation of the west side of the said street, for a distance of 400 feet or thereby, to a point there in the bed or shore of the River or Firth of Clyde between high and low

water mark, thence in a westerly and south-westerly direction between high and low water mark, on the northern side of the said Island of Inchgreen, for a distance of 950 feet or thereby, to a point there in the bed or shore of the River or Firth of Clyde, between high and low water mark, off the western end of the said Island of Inchgreen, proceeding thence along the bed or shore of the River or Firth of Clyde southward of the said Island of Inchgreen in a south-south-easterly direction for a distance of 192 feet or thereby, thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 559 feet or thereby, thence in a direction east by north for a distance of 202 feet or thereby, thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 81 feet or thereby, and terminating at the point in the west side of the said street before described as the point of the commencement of the embankment, which embankment will be situate in the bed or shore of the River or Firth of Clyde, between high and low water mark, and will surround the said Island of Inchgreen except where it crosses the eastern end of the said Island as aforesaid.

Seventeenth.—To authorise the Board to purchase, by compulsion or agreement, lands, houses, and property for the purposes of the said embankment, and other works, and also to purchase, by compulsion or agreement, and to hold for the Gas Works and the other purposes of the Bill, so much of the said Island of Inchgreen and land adjoining thereto, containing in quantity $8\frac{3}{4}$ acres or thereby, as is included within the line of the embankment hereinbefore described, or some part or parts of the said lands, houses, and property.

Eighteenth.—To authorise the Board on such lands, lastly before described, or any part or parts thereof, to erect, make and maintain Gas Works, Gasometers, Retorts, Machinery, Apparatus, Buildings, Approaches, Works, and Conveniences, and to Manufacture and Sell Gas, and the several matters producible from the residual products arising or resulting from the manufacture of gas, and generally to carry on the operations and works which are carried on by Corporations and Companies who manufacture and supply gas for public and private lighting.

Nineteenth.—To authorise the Board to construct such works as may be required for conveying Gas from the new works to be erected by them to any districts or district within which they may, by the Bill, be authorised to sell or supply Gas, and to lay down, continue, maintain, and renew mains and pipes in, under, over, or upon the turnpike or other roads, lanes, streets, railways, canals, cuts, rivers, aqueducts, bridges, and other places, and to do all acts, matters, and things necessary for such purposes.

Twentieth.—To deviate laterally from the lines of the embankment and other works to the extent shown on the plans hereinafter mentioned, and to deviate vertically from the levels shown on the sections hereinafter mentioned.

Twenty first.—To cross, stop up, alter, remove, divert, or otherwise interfere with, either temporarily or permanently, all roads, highways, footpaths, streets, streams, rivers, bridges, quays, landing-places, landing stages, sewers, drains, culverts, ways and watercourses and the bed and shore of the River or Firth of Clyde, within or adjoining to the aforesaid Parishes, or which it may be necessary or convenient to cross, stop up, alter, divert, or interfere with, for the purpose of

the intended embankment and other works aforesaid or of the Bill.

Twenty-second.—To reclaim, enclose, and appropriate, for the purposes of the Bill so much of the bed and shore of the River or Firth of Clyde, within the aforesaid Parishes, as is situate between the line of the embankment hereinbefore described, and the said Island of Inchgreen, and also so much of the said bed and shore as may be necessary for making the embankment and other works, to be authorised by the Bill.

Twenty-third.—To authorise the Board to supply Gas for public and private purposes, and to light with gas all or some of the public streets, thoroughfares, passages, and places within the Parish of Greenock (including those districts known as the West, New or Middle, and East Parishes of Greenock), in the County of Renfrew, and to sell and supply gas to the inhabitants within the said Parish or Parishes and districts, and to light public and private buildings, shops, warehouses, manufactories, railways, railway stations, docks, quays, wharves, bridges, and other works, and to sell and supply Gas for any other purposes, and within the said Parish or Parishes and Districts, to break up and interfere with streets, roads, lanes, bridges, and other passages, and places and sewers, drains, pipes, and telegraph apparatus therein, and to lay down, place, renew, and maintain, gas mains, gas pipes, lamps, pillars and posts, and to manufacture, supply, hire, sell and let gas meters, fittings and gas apparatus, and to hold and acquire patent rights or licenses, to use patent rights in relation to the manufacture and distribution of gas and the utilisation of residual products, and to enter into contracts for a supply of gas with the Corporation or with any other Corporations or bodies, and persons within the said Parish or Parishes and Districts aforesaid, and other places adjoining to the said Parish or Parishes and Districts.

Twenty-fourth.—To authorise the compulsory purchase of lands, houses, and other heritages for the purposes of the Bill, and the taking of lands, houses, and other heritages by agreement, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges connected therewith or otherwise interfering with the objects of the Bill, to alter existing rates, rents, charges and assessments, and to vary and extinguish exemptions from rates, rents, charges and assessments, and to confer exemptions from payment of rates, rents, and charges, and to make provision for all matters necessary or incidental to the objects of the Bill.

Twenty-fifth.—To authorise the Board to levy, collect, and recover rates, rents, and charges for the supply of Gas, and for the sale and use of meters, fittings, and all other matters and things supplied or sold by them, and to grant exemptions from the payment of such rates, rents, and charges, and to confer exemptions from rates, rents, and charges.

Twenty-sixth.—To authorise the Board to levy special rates and assessments on and from the occupiers of all lands, houses, and heritages within the limits of Greenock as defined in the fourth section of the Act of 1865, or any parts thereof, for carrying into effect the objects of the Bill with reference to the acquisition of the existing Gas Works, and the several powers proposed to be conferred by the Bill for the purposes of the Gas supply.

Twenty-seventh.—To authorise the Board to borrow, and from time to time to re-borrow, money for the purposes of the Bill, on Mortgage, Bond, Annuity, Cash Credit, or otherwise, and to charge moneys borrowed on the rates, rents, and assessments to be authorised by the Bill, or on any rates or assessments the Board have already or may hereafter have power to levy, and also on the lands, houses, and properties to be purchased or acquired under the provisions of the Bill, and on any other property from time to time belonging to or to be acquired by them, and the revenues, rates, rents, and charges to arise or to be levied and made under the Bill, and to apply the rents, rates, and profits of the Gas Works to the general purposes of the Board, and, if expedient, to fund the debt so to be created.

Twenty-eighth.—To authorise payment by the Board, out of monies to be borrowed and raised under the Bill, of interest on the sum for the time being raised or owing by the Board, for the purpose of erecting and constructing new Gas Works, and that until such works shall have been completed and in operation, or as shall be defined in the Bill.

Twenty-ninth.—To incorporate with, and extend, and apply to the purposes of the Bill all or some of the provisions of "The Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847," "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," "The General Police and Improvement (Scotland) Act, 1862," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts 1860 and 1869," and "The Railways Clauses Act, 1863," or wholly or partially to exempt the Board from any of the provisions of those Acts, or either of them, or to modify or alter the same with reference to all or any of the objects of the Bill, and to vary or extinguish any rights or privileges thereunder or under any other Act or Acts, Letters Patent, Charters, Agreements, Deeds, or otherwise.

Thirtieth.—To alter, amend, extend, and enlarge, or to repeal all or some of the powers and provisions of the Act of 1840, and of the Act of 1865, and of "The General Police and Improvement (Scotland) Act, 1862," and any other Acts relating to the Town of Greenock.

Thirty-first.—To alter, vary, or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might prevent, impede, or interfere with any of the objects aforesaid, or of the Bill being carried into effect, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary or expedient for effecting the said objects, or in relation thereto.

Thirty-second.—Duplicate Plans and Sections describing the lines, situations, and levels of the intended works, and the lands, houses and property to be taken compulsorily under the powers of the Bill, and a Book of Reference to the Plans, containing the names of the owners, or reputed owners, lessees, or reputed lessees, and of the occupiers of such lands, houses, and property, and a copy of this Notice, as published in the *Edinburgh Gazette*, will, on or before the 30th day of November, 1870, be deposited for public inspection with the principal Sheriff-Clerk of the County of Renfrew, at his offices at Greenock and Paisley respectively, and a copy of so much of the said Plans, Sections, and Books of Reference as relates to each of the parishes in which the said works and lands are situate, with a copy of this Notice, as published in the *Edinburgh Gazette*, will be also deposited on or before the said 30th day

of November, 1870, with the Schoolmaster, or if there be no Schoolmaster, with the Session-Clerk of each such parish, at the usual place of abode of such Schoolmaster or Session-Clerk.

Printed Copies of the intended Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 21st day of December, 1870.

New Works for Additional Supply of Water from Melgum, Inzion, and Loch of Lintrathen, to Dundee and Suburbs, and Places adjacent; Power to take, Compulsorily and otherwise, Lands, Waters, and Streams, and to Divert Waters and Streams; Power to give off Water in bulk to Persons, Corporations, and Public Authorities beyond Limits of Supply; New Roads and Diversions, and Appropriations of Existing Roads; Additional Reservoirs, Conduits, Pipes, and other Works, and Powers of Alteration of Old and New Works; Power to make Agreements with Landowners and other Parties; Power to Borrow Money; Rates and Assessments; Repeal or Amendment of Acts; and other Purposes.

NOTICE is Hereby Given, that it is intended to apply to Parliament, in the ensuing Session, for leave to bring in a Bill to enable the Dundee Water Commissioners (hereinafter called the Commissioners) to effect the objects and purposes aftermentioned, or some of them; that is to say—

To authorise the Commissioners to make, lay down, and maintain the following Works, or some of them, with all proper conveniences, approaches, and accommodations connected therewith, viz. :—

1. A Reservoir to be situate on the River or Water known as the Melgum or Melgam (hereinafter and throughout this Notice called the Melgum), and on the River or Water known as the Inzion Burn (hereinafter and throughout this Notice called the Inzion Burn), and on the Loch of Lintrathen, and on the Lands adjacent thereto within the Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar; and which Reservoir will be formed by an Embankment across the said Melgum, at a point on the said Melgum 75 yards or thereabouts measured up the course of the said Melgum from the centre of the Bridge by which the Public Road from Alyth by Milnacraig to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen is carried over the said Melgum at Bridgend of Lintrathen, at which point the said Reservoir will commence, and will extend up the said Melgum and terminate at a point 20 yards or thereabouts, measured up the course of the said Melgum from the centre of the Ford in the Melgum of the Public Road known as the Lochside Road (being the Road leading off the said Public Road from Alyth at or near Bridgend of Lintrathen, and from thence running by the northerly side of the Loch of Lintrathen to and joining the Public Road from Kirriemuir to Glenisla at or near the Farm Steading of

Inzion), and will also extend up the Inzion Burn and terminate at a point measured up the course of the said Burn 200 yards or thereabouts from its junction with the Melgum, and will cover the Loch of Lintrathen and adjacent Lands, and will be wholly situate in the said Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar.

2. A Road, to be wholly situate in the said Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar, and to commence in and by a junction with the Public Road from Kirriemuir to Glenisla, at a point 682 yards, or thereabouts, measured in an easterly direction along the said Public Road, from the centre of the Bridge by which the said Public Road is carried over the Inzion Burn, and to terminate in and by a junction with the said Public Road from Alyth to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen, at a point 160 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a north-easterly direction along the said last-mentioned Road from the centre of the Bridge by which the said Road is carried over the Melgum at Bridgend of Lintrathen.

3. A Road, to be wholly situate in the aforesaid Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar, and to commence in and by a junction with the said Public Road called the Lochside Road, at a point 551 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a southerly direction along said Lochside Road, from the centre of the Ford in the Melgum of the said Lochside Road, and to terminate in and by a junction with the said Public Road from Alyth to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen, at a point 318 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a westerly direction along said road from the point where the westerly boundary of the Wood known as the Craigyloch Wood joins the said Road.

4. A Cut or Drain, to be wholly situate in the said Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar, and in the Wood known as Craigyloch Wood, to commence at a point in the said Wood immediately on the south side of the said Public Road from Alyth to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen, by a junction with an existing Drain crossing the said Road at a point 535 yards, or thereabouts, measured in an easterly direction along said Road from the point where the westerly boundary of the said Craigyloch Wood joins said Road, and to terminate at the south-west corner of the said Wood.

5. A Road, to be wholly situate in the said Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar, and to commence in and by a junction with the said Public Road from Alyth to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen, at a point 670 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a south-westerly direction along said Road from the centre of the Bridge by which said Road is carried over the Melgum at Bridgend of Lintrathen, and to terminate in and by a junction with the Public Road leading from Bridgend of Lintrathen southwards by Bridge of Lundies into the Parish of Airlie at a point 71 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a southerly direction along the said Road from the south-westerly corner of the Post Office at Bridgend of Lintrathen.

6. The foresaid public road known as the Lochside Road, in the aforesaid Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar, to be raised, such raising to commence at a point on the said road 46 yards, or thereabouts, measured along such road in a northerly direction from the centre of the ford in the Melgum of the said road, and to terminate 35 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a southerly direction along said road from the centre of the said ford, and which raising will embrace a

Bridge over the Melgum, in place of the existing Ford and adjoining Foot Bridge.

7. A portion of the said public road from Alyth to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen, in the aforesaid Parish of Lintrathen, and County of Forfar, to be raised, such raising to commence at a point in the said road 453 yards, or thereabouts, measured in an easterly direction along such road from the point where the westerly boundary of the Wood known as the Craigyloch Wood joins the said road, and thence extending in an easterly direction 132 yards, or thereabouts, along the said road, where it will terminate.

8. An Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, to commence in the Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar, in and out of the intended Reservoir firstly before described, at a point in the Melgum 183 yards, or thereabouts, measured up the course of the said Melgum, from the centre of the Bridge by which the said Public Road from Alyth to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen is carried over the Melgum at Bridgend of Lintrathen, and to terminate within the Parish of Monikie and County of Forfar, at a point in the south side of the old course of the Burn known as the Crombie Burn, within the existing Reservoir of the Commissioners known as the Crombie Reservoir, 67 yards, or thereabouts, measured in an easterly direction from the Well known as the King's Well, at or near the westerly end of said Reservoir; which said Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, will pass from, in, through, or into the following Parishes, or some of them—viz., the Parishes of Lintrathen, Kingoldrum, Airlie, Glamis, Inverarity, Monikie, Guthrie, and Carmyllie, in the County of Forfar, and the Parish of Caputh, in the County of Perth.

9. An Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, to be wholly situate in the Parish of Monikie and County of Forfar, and to commence in and out of the Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, eighthly herein described, 60 yards or thereabouts from the termination thereof, at a point on the land belonging to the Commissioners, where an imaginary line, measured 50 yards or thereabouts, in a southerly direction from the foresaid Well, known as the King's Well, would intersect an imaginary line, measured 150 yards or thereabouts, in an easterly direction from the centre of the Bridge, near Fallaws farm-steading, carrying the Dundee and Forfar Railway, commonly called the Dundee and Forfar Direct Railway, forming part of the undertaking of the Caledonian Railway Company, over the Public Road which runs from Kirkton of Monikie, through or along Fallaws, to and beyond East Skichen, and to terminate in the existing water-course of the Commissioners, which conveys the water from their existing Crombie Reservoir to their existing Reservoirs at Craigton of Monikie, at a point in the said water-course 10 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a southerly direction along such water-course from the southerly end of the tunnel or culvert which conveys the water from the said Crombie Reservoir into the said water-course.

10. An Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, to commence within the Parish of Carmyllie and County of Forfar, in the Burn known as the Hyndcastle Burn, at a point 69 yards, or thereabouts, measured up the course of the said Burn from the point where the railing or fence, forming the most westerly boundary of the land belonging to the Commissioners, crosses the said Burn, and to terminate within the Parish of Monikie and

County of Forfar, in the waste-water course of the existing Crombie Reservoir of the Commissioners, at a point in the said waste-water course 55 yards, or thereabouts, measured along the said waste-water course in an easterly direction from the centre of the ridge-stone or overflow forming the waste weir of the said Crombie Reservoir, which said Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes will pass from, in, through, or into the Parishes of Monikie and Carmyllie, or one of them, in the County of Forfar.

11. An Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, to commence in the Parish of Carmyllie and County of Forfar, at an angle in the railing or fence forming the northern boundary of the land belonging to the Commissioners at the Crombie Reservoir, which said angle is the most northerly point in said railing or fence, and is situated 260 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a south-easterly direction from the south-easterly corner of the farm dwelling-house of East Skichen, and to terminate in the Parish of Monikie and County of Forfar by a junction with the existing water-course of the Commissioners at or near to the foot of the outer slope of the existing Crombie Reservoir Embankment, at a point in the said water-course 27 yards, or thereabouts, measured in an easterly direction along said water-course from the easterly end of the tunnel or culvert, which discharges the water from the said Crombie Reservoir into the said water-course; and which said Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, will pass from, in, through, or into the Parishes of Carmyllie, Panbride, and Monikie, or some, or one of them, all in the County of Forfar.

12. An Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, to be wholly situate in the Parish of Monikie and County of Forfar, and to commence in and out of the aqueduct called the Little Aqueduct, near the north-westerly corner of the most southerly settling Reservoir of the Commissioners at Craigton of Monikie, at a point in the said Aqueduct 10 yards, or thereabouts, measured in an easterly direction along such Aqueduct, from the easterly end of the tunnel or culvert which conveys the water from the said Aqueduct into the basin known as the Clear-water Basin, at Craigton of Monikie, and to terminate in the Straining Well in the north-westerly corner of the said Clear-water Basin.

13. A Reservoir, to be situate in the Parish and Burgh of Dundee and County of Forfar, on the easterly slope of Dundee Law, in a field or garden forming part of the land known as Stirling's Park, occupied by George Fraser, which Reservoir will commence at a point in the said field or garden where an imaginary line, measured 121 yards or thereabouts, in a westerly direction from the north-west corner of the most westerly house on the south side of Hill Street, Dundee, will intersect an imaginary line, measured 430 yards or thereabout, in a south-easterly direction from the south-east corner of the dwelling-house of the farm-steading called Lawton, and thence extend along such field in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 56 yards or thereabouts, thence in a south-easterly direction 71 yards or thereabouts, thence in a north-easterly direction 31 yards or thereabouts, and thence in a north-westerly direction 57 yards or thereabouts, to its point of commencement, where it will terminate.

14. An Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, to commence within the Parish of Murroes and County of Forfar, in and out of the existing Well

of the Commissioners known as Gagie Well, near to the farm-steading of Eastertown of Gagie, and to terminate within the Parish and Burgh of Dundee and County of Forfar, in the intended Reservoir thirteenthly before-described, at the point of commencement of the said Reservoir therein specified; and which Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes will pass from, in, through, or into the Parish of Murroes, United Parishes of Mains and Strathmartine, Parish of Dundee, Burgh of Dundee, or some or one of them, all in the County of Forfar.

15. An Aqueduct, Conduit, or Line of Pipes, to be wholly situate in the Parish and Burgh of Dundee and County of Forfar, commencing in and out of the Reservoir thirteenthly before described, at the point of the commencement of the said Reservoir, and terminating at a point in Hill Street, Dundee, 5 yards or thereabouts due north of the westerly end of the most westerly house on the south side of the said street.

To take and divert into and to impound and store up in the said intended Reservoir firstly before described, for the purposes of the said Bill, the Waters of the said Loch of Lintrathen and affluents thereof, and to intercept, divert, and take into the said Reservoir and therein to impound and store up for the said purposes the Waters of the said Melgum and affluents thereof, and of the said Inzion Burn and affluents thereof, and therein and from thence by the said intended Works, and by the existing Undertaking and Works of the Commissioners, or one or more of them, to use and appropriate the said several waters for an additional supply of Water to the Burgh of Dundee, and Suburbs, and Places adjacent, within the limits of "The Dundee Water Act 1869," and to the Inhabitants thereof; and to provide compensation Water to streams and persons whose present supply of Water may be affected by or in consequence of the Works to be authorised by said Bill, or any of them, and to supply such other Persons, Corporations, or Public Authorities as the Commissioners may think fit, or otherwise as may be provided in the said Bill; and which Loch of Lintrathen and the Waters thereof, so far as discharged therefrom, flow into the Melgum; and which Inzion Burn and the Waters thereof also flow into the Melgum; and which Melgum and the Waters thereof flow into the River Isla, and from thence into the River Tay, and from thence into the German Ocean.

To fix and define the amount of compensation water to be provided to streams or persons affected, or that may be affected, by the intended abstraction and diversion of water and the intended Works of the Commissioners, and to regulate and define the means by which, and the manner in which, such compensation water is to be supplied.

To make, lay, erect, and maintain such Embankments, Dams, Weirs, Channels, Sluices, Catch-water Drains, Culverts, Cuts, Aqueducts, Tunnels, Bridges, Roads, Cisterns, Gauges, Main and Distributing Pipes, Houses, Buildings, and all other Works and Conveniences, or alterations of any existing Works, Conduits, Aqueducts, Mains, Pipes, or Conveniences whatsoever, which may be necessary or expedient for effecting or carrying out the objects or purposes of the said Bill, or any of them; as also, from time to time to extend, alter, replace, increase, and enlarge the existing Works, Conduits, Aqueducts, Mains, and Pipes of the Commissioners, and the Works, Conduits, Aqueducts, Mains, and Pipes to be authorised by

the said Bill, and to extend, alter, replace, enlarge, and increase the number and size of the Works, Mains, and Pipes for conveying and distributing water for the purposes of the said Bill.

To deviate from the lines and situations of the said intended Works within the limits shown upon the plans hereinafter mentioned, or as shall be specified in the Bill; and to deviate vertically from the levels of those Works, as shown upon the sections hereinafter mentioned or as shall be specified in the Bill.

To carry the said intended Reservoirs, Aqueducts, Conduits, Pipes, and other Works through, over, under, across, along, upon, or into, and for that purpose, as well as for the purpose of maintaining the same, and any conveniences connected therewith, temporarily or permanently to use, cross, divert, alter, or stop up any Turnpike Road, Statute-labour Road, Public Highway, or other Road, Footpath, Street, Canal, Railway, Tramway, Bridge, Stream, River, Sewer, Aqueduct, Reservoir, Drain, or place.

To confirm all or any Agreements that may be made between the Commissioners and the Right Honourable the Earl of Airlie in regard to any part of the Lands, Houses, Waters, Streams, or Property to be taken for the purposes of the said intended Bill or otherwise, or between the Commissioners and any other Landowner.

To Borrow further money for the general purposes of the Commissioners, and also for the purposes of the said intended Bill, upon the security of the Rates and Revenues and whole Undertaking present and future of the Commissioners, and, if thought expedient, to provide for the payment of the money already borrowed; as also to alter, suspend, or postpone the operation of the provisions contained in "The Dundee Water Act, 1869," regarding the Sinking Fund thereby provided, and to make other provisions regarding a Sinking Fund, or otherwise.

IV., cap. 61; Acts relating to the Burgh of Dundee, and the Roads and Streets therein, viz., 51 Geo. III., cap. 15; 6 Geo. IV., cap. 183; 7 Wm. (1.) To alter, enlarge, extend, and define, for municipal and other purposes (except the election of Members to serve in Parliament), the muni-

said north-west corner of the said property belonging or reputed to belong to the said James Riddel; thence south-eastward along the south-west boundary of the Great North of Scotland Railway (Waterloo Branch Line), to the west side of the Bridge over the said Railway at Froghall; thence across the said Railway at the west side of the said Bridge, and south-eastward along the north-east boundary of the said Railway to the south-east extremity of the property of Froghall Cottage, belonging or reputed to belong to John Harper, Merchant; thence north-eastward along the south-east boundary of the said last-mentioned property to the point where the said boundary turns north-westward; thence eastward in a straight line to the south-west extremity of the property on the west side of the Spittal Road belonging, or reputed to belong to Gilbert Henderson, late Shipmaster; thence eastward along the south boundary of the said last-mentioned property and across the Spittal Road to the north-west side of Love Lane at its junction with the said last-mentioned road; thence north-eastward along the north side of Love Lane to the west side of King Street Road; thence northward along the west side of the said last-mentioned road, to a point opposite the line of the south-west side of the road which leads from King Street Road to the Police Dung Stances, thence across King Street Road and eastward along the south side of the said road, which leads to the Police Dung Stances, and along the north boundary of the ground used as a Rifle Range, to the Links; thence eastward along a straight line drawn in continuation of the said north boundary of the ground used as a Rifle Range, to the Seashore at low water mark; thence southward along the Seashore at low water mark to the North Pier; thence along the north side of the said North Pier to the eastern extremity of the said Pier; thence in a straight line in an easterly direction into the Sea, to a point 166 yards or thereby east of the said extremity of the said North Pier; thence southward from said last-mentioned point in a straight line to the centre line of the navigation channel of the Harbour; thence south-westward along the centre line of the said navigation channel and of the channel of the River Dee as diverted, or authorised to be diverted, under the authority of "The Aberdeen Harbour Act, 1868," to the point of commencement.

The territory within the Boundary and limits foresaid, which is at present beyond the Municipal Limits and boundaries of the City, but is now proposed to be added to the City is in this Notice referred to as the District to be added. The extended City will be wholly situate within the Parish of Saint Nicholas, and the Divisions of said Parish called the East Parish, West Parish, North Parish, South Parish, Greyfriars Parish, and St Clement's Parish, and the Parish of Oldmachar, all in the County of Aberdeen, and the Parish of Nigg, in the County of Kincardine, or some or one of them.

(3.) To divide and arrange the extended City into Wards, and to re-arrange and alter the several existing Wards within the City, or some of them, and to alter, increase or lessen, the boundaries of the existing Wards or some of them, or to increase the extent of the existing Wards by adding thereto portions of the District to be added, or otherwise to alter the Division of the City into Wards, and to fix the number and boundaries of the new Wards, and in other respects to alter, amend, extend or repeal, so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the Bill, some of the powers and provisions of the several Acts now in force relating to the formation of Wards in Burghs or Cities in Scotland, and the arrangement of Wards in the City, made in pursuance thereof, and amongst others the following Acts (public and general), that is to say :—3 and 4 William IV., chapter 76 ; 4 and 5 William IV., chapter 87 ; 15 and 16 Victoria, chapter 32 ; 16 Victoria, chapter 26 ; 19 and 20 Victoria, chapter 58 ; 20 and 21 Victoria, chapter 70 ; 23 and 24 Victoria, chapter 47 ; 24 and 25 Victoria, chapter 36 ; 31 and 32 Victoria, chapter 108 ; and 33 and 34 Victoria, chapter 92.

(4.) To alter the constitution of the Town Council, and to alter the present number, and to increase and fix for the future the number of the Baillies and Town Councillors, and to make provisions as to their qualification and election, and as to the qualification, registration and voting, of electors within the extended City.

(5.) To confer upon all persons similarly qualified, resident or having places of business within the District to be added, the same right to vote for the election of Town Councillors as is at present possessed by persons resident or having places of business within the City.

(6.) To extend, and to enlarge and make co-extensive with and over the extended City the jurisdiction, powers, authorities, duties, rights and privileges, or some parts or portion thereof now possessed, enjoyed or exercised, or which are possessed and enjoyed, and might be exercised by the Lord Provost and Magistrates and by the Town Council, and also to vest in the Lord Provost and Magistrates and the Town Council, and in the several persons holding or hereafter to hold office under them, the same jurisdiction, powers, authorities, rights and privileges, in, over and in respect of the extended City, which they, as now constituted and appointed, at present possess, exercise or enjoy, or might exercise in, over and in respect of the City, or such other jurisdiction, powers, authorities, rights and privileges, as the Bill may define, as fully and effectually, to all intents and purposes, as if the District to be added now formed a part or portion of the City ; and to enable the Town Council to act by themselves, or jointly with others authorised to do so, as Trustees, Commissioners, or managers of, or in respect of any trust, undertaking or charity, in the same manner that they, as now constituted and appointed, have power to act, or in such manner as the Bill may define.

(7.) To confer upon the Town Council, with reference to and within the District to be added, all or some of the same powers which they now have within the City, or such other and further powers as the Bill may define, and particularly powers to levy and collect within the District to be added the same cess, rates, taxes and assessments as are now levied and collected within the

City, or other cess, rates, taxes, and assessments of the like nature.

(8.) To repeal or alter all or some of the powers of levying and collecting local rates and assessments within the City or within the district to be added, and to grant other powers to the Town Council of levying and collecting tolls, cess, rates, and assessments, and to repeal or alter so much of any Acts of Parliament as relate to the tolls, cess, rates, and assessments so to be abolished or altered, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof. And to abolish, alter, or vary the powers and jurisdictions of the Local Authorities within the district to be added, under the Acts 19 and 20 Victoria, chapter 103, and 30 and 31 Victoria, chapter 101, and to rescind, nullify, and make void and inoperative any Resolution or Resolutions of any such Local Authority in regard to the formation of any Special Drainage District or Districts under the said Acts, and to provide that the Town Council shall be the Local Authority under the said Acts for the City or District to be added.

(9.) To abolish and extinguish the right presently possessed and exercised by the Guildry, or Burgesses of Guild of the City of Aberdeen, of electing a person to the office of Dean of Guild, such person being in virtue of such election a constituent member of the Town Council, and to provide that the Town Council shall have, possess, and exercise the right of nominating and electing one of their own number to fill the office of Dean of Guild, and that the person so nominated and elected by the Town Council shall enjoy all the powers and privileges, and perform all the duties and functions now exercised, enjoyed, or performed by the existing Dean of Guild of the City.

(10.) To provide for the abolition of the Dean of Guild Court, and for the transfer of all the jurisdictions, powers, rights, and authorities of that Court to the Sheriff of Aberdeen and Kincardine.

(11.) To transfer to the Town Council the whole powers and authorities of every kind at present vested in the Commissioners of Police of the City under "The Aberdeen Police and Water Works Act, 1862," and the Acts amending the same, and by "The Aberdeen County and Municipal Buildings Act, 1866," and by any Act with the said Acts incorporated, or by any other Acts ; to provide that such powers and authorities shall be exercised by the Town Council as in place of the Commissioners of Police, and to extend the provisions of those Acts, or some of them, to the district to be added, or to some portion thereof.

(12.) To transfer to the Town Council all, or some part or parts, of the property and revenues of every description at present belonging to the said Commissioners of Police, or to any local authority within the District to be added, or any of them ; to provide for the payment and liquidation of monies borrowed and obligations incurred by them, or any or either of them, or some part or parts thereof ; and to make such arrangements in regard to the matters aforesaid, as may be expedient, or as the Bill may define, and to make compensation, if thought proper, in respect of offices abolished or rendered unnecessary by the provisions of the Bill.

(13.) To vest in the Town Council all sewers and drains in or under any public street within the district to be added.

(14.) To empower the Town Council to purchase and take by compulsion or agreement for and to

use and employ the next-mentioned lands or some part or parts thereof for sewage and sewage utilization purposes, and thereon to deal with, receive, collect, store, disinfect, deodorise, distribute, utilize and apply to purposes of agriculture, irrigation or fertilization or other like purposes, and in such manner as they may deem fit, the whole or any part of the sewage and sewage matter now or at any time hereafter flowing through or into or being in or upon any of the reservoirs, sewers, drains or channels of the Town Council or the Commissioners of Police, within the City and extended City. The lands to which the compulsory powers in this paragraph above-mentioned relate are situate in the parish of Saint Nicholas and the Division thereof called the North Parish, and in the Royal Burgh of Aberdeen, and in the parish of Oldmachar, or in some or one of them, all in the County of Aberdeen, and are included within the boundary and limits following (that is to say) :—

Commencing at the north side of the path or road which leads from King Street past the powder magazine, at the point where the said path or road joins King Street, proceeding thence eastward along the north side of the said path or road to the point where the same joins the Park Road, thence north-eastward along the north-west side of the said Park Road, for a distance of 195 yards or thereby, thence in a straight line eastward, in line of the south side of the Life Boat-house on the Old Town Links to the Sea Beach at high-water mark of ordinary spring tides, thence northward along the Sea Beach at high-water mark to the south bank of the River Don, thence westward along the south bank of the River Don at high-water mark for a distance of 270 yards or thereby, thence westward in a straight line to the east side of the south abutment of the southmost arch of the Bridge of Don, thence southward along the east side of the King Street Road to the north boundary of the property belonging or reputed to belong to John Johnston, Grocer, thence eastward along the north boundary of the last-mentioned property to the north-east corner of said property, thence southward in a straight line drawn in continuation of the east boundary of the last-mentioned property to the north side of the road which leads from King Street Road past the Seaton Brick and Tile Works, thence south eastward along the north side of the said road which leads past the Seaton Brick and Tile Works to a point opposite the line of the south boundary of the ground belonging to the Trustees of John Harrow's Mortification, thence westward across the said last-mentioned road and along the said south boundary of the said ground belonging to the said Trustees of John Harrow's Mortification for a distance of 380 yards or thereby, thence southward in a straight line to a point in the north bank of Powis Burn 200 yards north-eastward (measured along the said Burn) from the east side of the King Street Road, thence eastward along the north bank of Powis Burn for a distance of 320 yards or thereby, thence eastward in a straight line to a point in the boundary of the Freedom Lands of Aberdeen 100 yards southward

from the March Stone number 64 in the boundary of the said Freedom Lands, thence southward along the boundary of the said Freedom Lands to the March Stone number 63 in the said boundary, thence westward along the south boundary of the property belonging to Henry Knight Erskine of Pittodrie to the King Street Road, thence southward along the east side of the King Street Road and of King Street to the point of commencement above described.

To enable the Town Council to construct such works and do all such other things as may be necessary for effecting such purposes as aforesaid, and also to take leases or grants of or easements over the lands, houses, and other property above described, or some part or parts thereof requisite for the said sewage and other purposes.

(15.) To enable the Town Council to construct and maintain, and from time to time to alter, extend and improve, cleanse and repair, for the purposes last aforesaid, the following works, or some or one of them (that is to say) :—

First.—A main sewer, conduit or pipe, conduits or line of pipes, in King Street Road, with all necessary manholes, storm overflows and other necessary works and conveniences along the course thereof, commencing by a junction with the existing sewer in said road at a point on the said road opposite Love Lane, and terminating in the said road at the south extremity of the Bridge of Don; and also a branch conduit or pipe from the said main sewer, conduit or pipe in King Street Road, from a point in the said road 230 yards or thereby northward (measured along said road), from the north side of Ladymill, and terminating in a field on the north side of Powis Burn, belonging to Hugh Fraser Leslie of Powis, and occupied by Agnes Duncan, at a point in said field 275 yards or thereby west from the March Stone number 64 in the boundary of the Freedom Lands of Aberdeen; and also another branch conduit or pipe from the said main sewer, conduit or pipe in King Street Road from a point in the said road 150 yards or thereby northward (measured along said road), from the road which leads from King Street Road past the Seaton Brick and Tile Works, and terminating in a field belonging to James Gordon Hay of Seaton, and occupied by George Tait, on the north side of the said road which leads past the Seaton Brick and Tile Works at a point in said field 280 yards or thereby north-eastward from the north side of the said last-mentioned road at its junction with the King Street Road, all in the Parish of Saint Nicholas, and the Divisions thereof called the North Parish, and Greyfriars Parish, and in the Royal Burgh of Aberdeen, and in the Parish of Oldmachar, or in some or one of them, all in the County of Aberdeen.

Second.—All necessary and proper sewers, drains, channels and junctions with sewers, and all necessary sluices, cuts, pipes, filtering or disinfecting beds, machinery, wastegates, guages, regulating basins, reservoirs, approaches and conveniences connected with the before-mentioned main sewer, conduit or pipe, conduits or line of pipes, and other

works, or any of them, in the said parishes and Royal Burgh, or some or one of them.

Third.—All necessary and convenient pumping stations, tanks, pumps, pipes, works and conveniences for the intercepting, lifting, conveying, receiving, storing, disinfecting, distributing and utilizing the sewage and sewage matter aforesaid, and all such works, matters and things as may be necessary or convenient for effecting the purposes aforesaid.

(16.) To enable the Town Council to construct a sea wall or embankment across the mouth of the Burn or stream called the Tile Burn, commencing on the south bank of the River Don at a point 400 yards or thereby measuring in an easterly direction from the east side of the south abutment of the southmost pier of the Bridge of Don, passing along the said south bank and terminating thereon at a point 700 yards or thereby, measuring in an easterly direction from the east side of the said abutment, and which sea wall or embankment will be wholly within the parish of Oldmachar and County of Aberdeen; and to enable the Town Council to enclose, reclaim, warp, improve, drain and to convert to agricultural and other purposes by sewage, irrigation and otherwise, the lands and banks or sandbanks in the said parish and county, which will be enclosed by the said sea wall or embankment, and to acquire and hold in fee simple, or on lease or otherwise, and to sell, let, mortgage or otherwise dispose of the lands so to be enclosed, reclaimed, improved, drained, and converted.

(17.) To transfer to the Town Council the whole or some of the powers and authorities at present vested in the "Burgh of Aberdeen Road Trustees," appointed and acting under and by virtue of "The Aberdeenshire Roads Act, 1865," and to provide that such powers and authorities shall be exercised by the Town Council as in place of the said Road Trustees, and to transfer to the Town Council all or some part or parts of the property and revenues at present belonging to the said Trustees.

(18.) To enable the Town Council to purchase by compulsion or by agreement upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon or as may be fixed by the provisions of the Bill, and to hold, use and exercise the undertaking, property, rights, privileges, and interests of the Gas Light Company of Aberdeen, and to enable the said Company to sell their undertaking to the Town Council, and if need be to provide for the winding up and dissolution of that Company.

(19.) To enable the Town Council to maintain and improve and from time to time to alter and extend the existing works belonging to the said Gas Company, and to erect, construct, and maintain such other works, buildings, and conveniences as may be necessary for the manufacture, storage, and distribution of Gas, and for the manufacture, conversion, storage, and utilization of the residual products, matters and things arising from the manufacture of Gas.

(20.) To enable the Town Council to manufacture, sell, and supply Gas for public and private purposes, and to light with Gas the extended City and the suburbs thereof and places adjacent thereto within the following Parishes or some or one of them, or so much thereof as the Bill will define, that is to say:—The Parish of Saint Nicholas and the divisions of said Parish called the East Parish, West Parish, North Parish, South Parish, Greyfriars Parish, and Saint Clement's

Parish, and the Parishes of Oldmachar, Newhills, Peterculter, and Banchory - Devenick, in the County of Aberdeen, and the Parishes of Maryculter, Banchory - Devenick, and Nigg, in the County of Kincardine, and to supply Gas for lighting the public streets, thoroughfares, passages, and places in the extended City and suburbs thereof, and places adjacent thereto, within the parishes aforesaid, and to supply and sell Gas to the inhabitants and occupiers of property in the said extended City and suburbs and places adjacent thereto within the parishes aforesaid, and for lighting public and private buildings, shops, and warehouses, manufactories, railways, railway stations, docks, quays, wharves, bridges, and works, and for any other purposes, and to sell and to dispose of the coke and other residuum and products arising from the manufacture of Gas, and to make, purchase, and hire gas meters and gas apparatus, and to sell or let the same, and to lay down and maintain gas mains and pipes in, through, across, and under, and for that purpose to break open and interfere with sewers, drains, streets, roads, ways, and other public passages and places, and to hold and acquire patent rights and licences to use patent rights in relation to the manufacture and distribution of gas and the utilization of residual products, and to enter into contracts for a supply of Gas with any local authorities or public departments, and to enjoy all needful powers, rights, and privileges for the supply of Gas.

(21.) To authorise the Town Council to levy, collect, and recover rates, rents, or charges, for the supply of Gas, and for the sale and use of meters, fittings, and all other matters and things supplied or sold by them, and to grant exemptions from the payment of such rates, rents, and charges, and to authorise the Town Council to enter into agreements for lighting the streets and other places of the extended City and suburbs thereof, and places adjacent thereto within the parishes aforesaid.

(22.) To make provision with respect to the better draining, cleansing, paving, watching, lighting, supplying with water, and otherwise improving the extended City, and preserving and protecting the persons, property, peace, morality, decency, propriety, health, quiet and comfort of the inhabitants thereof and others, and for the definition, prevention, and punishment of offences within the extended City.

(23.) To enable the Town Council to make and maintain a Railway, with all proper junctions, sidings, roads, accesses, and other works and conveniences, commencing by a junction with the Great North of Scotland Railway at a point thereon sixty-six yards or thereby measuring in a southerly direction from the south side of the bridge, carrying the road called the "Mortar Hole Road" which leads from the Inverurie Road towards Old Aberdeen over the said Railway, and terminating in a field belonging to John Catto of Cattofield, and occupied by Alexander Middleton, at a point in said field one hundred and fifty yards or thereby measuring in a westerly direction from the house or building formerly used as the Kittybrewster Toll House, and which intended Railway will be wholly situate in the Parish of Old Machar and County of Aberdeen.

(24.) To enable the Town Council to construct and maintain a main, conduit, pipe, or sewer, commencing at or near the north side of the said house or building formerly used as the Kitty-

brewster Toll House, proceeding thence across the said Inverurie Road to the Great North of Scotland Railway, thence south-eastward along said Railway (Waterloo Branch Line) to a point nearly opposite to the Junction of the Inverurie Road and Causewayend, thence southward to Causewayend, thence south-eastward along Causewayend, and terminating by a connection or Junction with the existing sewer in Causewayend at or near the Junction of Causewayend and Charles Street, all in the Parish of Old Machar and County of Aberdeen.

(25.) To authorise the Town Council to erect, establish, maintain and regulate within the Parish of Oldmachar and County of Aberdeen new and suitable markets, market places, and market house or houses, with approaches and all suitable buildings, sheds, cattle pens, courts, passages and other conveniences and appurtenances within or connected therewith, for the sale of cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, and other animals, fish, butchers' meat, hides, tallow, and other marketable commodities; and to erect, establish, maintain, and regulate within the said parish new and suitable slaughter-houses and other buildings, sheds, accesses, appurtenances and conveniences connected with the said markets and slaughter-houses, and for slaughtering and dressing animals of all kinds, and buildings and places for the deposit and manufacture of offal, blood, tallow, garbage, and other products; and to grant leases of the said markets and slaughter-houses, or any or either of them, and the tolls and duties payable in respect thereof, and to provide for the proper inspection of diseased cattle and meat brought within the said markets and slaughter-houses, and that the blood, manure, garbage, and other refuse of animals slaughtered in the said slaughter-houses shall belong to the Town Council; and which markets, slaughter-houses and conveniences connected therewith respectively are proposed to be constructed upon lands and property situate within the boundary and limits following (that is to say):—

Commencing at the March Stone, Number 56, in the boundary of the Freedom Lands of Aberdeen, on the south-west side of the road which leads from the Inverurie Road past the west side of Cotton Lodge towards Woodside, proceeding thence south-eastward along the south-west side of the first-mentioned road, and of the Inverurie Road to the point where the said last-mentioned road meets the road which leads therefrom towards Belmont and Ashgrove, thence south-westward along the north-west side of the said last-mentioned road till it meets the road which leads therefrom past Cattofield and Aslhill; thence north-westward along the north-east side of the said last-mentioned road for a distance of 165 yards or thereby, thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of 130 yards or thereby to a point in the south-west boundary fence of the Sunnybank Nursery 195 yards or thereby south westward from the March Stone first mentioned, thence north-eastward in a straight line to the point of commencement.

(26.) To purchase and take by compulsion or agreement, or to take leases or grants of or easements over the lands, houses, and other property

requisite for the construction of the said sea wall or embankment, Railway, sewers, main and branch conduits and pipes, markets, and slaughter-houses, or any of them, herein before mentioned, or any other objects of the Bill, and to vary, repeal, or extinguish all existing rights and privileges in any manner connected with such lands, houses, and property, which would in any way impede or interfere with such objects or the other objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges; and also to cross, alter, divert, and stop up such highways, turnpike or other roads, railways, streets, paths, passages, rivers, canals, brooks, streams, sewers, waters and watercourses, where necessary or expedient, for the purpose of making and maintaining, or using the said sea wall or embankment, railway, sewers, main and branch conduits, and pipes, markets and slaughter-houses, or any of the works, approaches, stations, or conveniences connected therewith respectively.

(27.) To prohibit, or restrict and regulate, or make other provision with respect to the several matters following, or some of them, that is to say:—the establishment, holding or use of markets, fairs and slaughter-houses, and the use of steelyards in markets, and of weights and measures; assemblages, shows, caravans, exhibitions and disturbances in markets and shambles, and in the streets, public places and elsewhere in the extended City; the laying out of streets and shutting up of lanes; the construction, use, and appropriation of buildings, factories, public houses, lodging-houses and other dwellings, furnaces, fire-places, water-closets, privies, drains, cesspools, ash-pits, wells, yards and pertinents; the consumption of smoke; the exercise of certain trades, businesses, and callings, and the creation of obstructions or annoyances in streets and public places, and other practices leading to crowds or tumults; to restrict or prevent the slaughtering of cattle within the limits of the City and extended City, or within such limits as may be defined in the Bill elsewhere than in the slaughter-houses erected by the Town Council; and to prohibit or restrict the sale or exposure of animals or things, and the placing of stalls or pens in the streets or public places, and other offences, annoyances, obstructions, disturbances, and inconveniences, and to inflict punishments for breach of such prohibitions, restrictions or regulations and provisions, all within the extended City.

(28.) To make provisions for the lighting, cleansing, alteration, levelling, paving, flagging and channelling, repairing, draining and metalling of streets, roads and other places within the extended City; and as to the expenses thereof.

(29.) To levy and collect tolls, rates, rents, dues, duties, cess and assessments in respect of the use of the said Railway, markets, slaughter-houses and conveniences, and generally for the purposes of the Bill, and to provide for the application of the same; to alter and extend such tolls, rates, rents, dues, duties, cess and assessments as are now leviable; and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from payment of all or any of the same.

(30.) To authorise the Town Council, if necessary, to levy special rates and assessments on and in respect of all lands, houses and heritages within the extended City or any part thereof, for carrying into effect all or any of the purposes of the Bill.

(31.) To authorise the Town Council to borrow, and from time to time to re-borrow, money for the purposes of "The Aberdeen County and Municipal

Buildings Act, 1866," and for the Railway, sea-wall or embankment, sewage, gas, police, markets, slaughter-houses, reclamation, and other purposes of the Bill or any of those purposes, on mortgage, bond, annuity, cash credit or otherwise, and to charge money borrowed on the credit and security of the tolls, rates, rents, dues, duties and assessments which they respectively now are or by the Bill may be authorised to levy and collect; and on the lands, houses and property belonging to, or to be acquired by them respectively, or any of them, or of the rents or property issuing or arising out of or from any lands, houses and property, from time to time in the possession of, or belonging to them respectively, or from any interest therein, or by any of those means; and to enable the Town Council to provide a sinking fund or sinking funds for the gradual extinction of the bonds, mortgages and other debts and liabilities incurred and to be incurred by them.

(32.) To authorise the Town Council to make, alter, vary and rescind bye-laws, rules, orders, regulations and resolutions for or with respect to any of the objects of the Bill, and to authorise and enforce the imposition of penalties for breach or non observance of those bye-laws, and to provide for the recovery and application of penalties.

(33.) To authorise the Town Council, and any other corporation, companies, bodies or persons having property situate, or powers exercisable within the extended City, to enter into and carry into effect contracts, agreements and arrangements with respect to any of the objects of the Bill, and any incidental matters.

(34.) To confer upon the Town Council and other local authorities all other powers and authorities necessary or desirable for effecting the objects and purposes comprised in this Notice, and to be comprised in the Bill; and to repeal, vary or extinguish all rights, powers, authorities, jurisdictions, privileges and exemptions which may in any way interfere with any of the objects and purposes aforesaid, or of the Bill; and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights, powers, authorities, jurisdictions, privileges, and exemptions.

(35.) To incorporate with the Bill such of the provisions of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860," "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," "The Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847," "The Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847," "The Sewage Utilization Acts, 1865 and 1867," "The Railways Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," and "The Railways Clauses Act, 1863," as are applicable, and not by the said Bill altered.

(36.) To alter, amend, extend and enlarge, or to repeal, so far as may be necessary or desirable for the purposes of the Bill, the powers and provisions, or some of the powers and provisions of the several Acts of Parliament in this Notice before mentioned, and of, amongst others, the several Acts of Parliament following—that is to say, the Acts 5 George IV., chapter 74; 6 George IV., chapter 12; 9 George IV., chapter 58; 5 and 6 William IV., chapter 63; 2 and 3 Victoria, chapter 64; 9 Victoria, chapter 17; 16 Victoria, chapter 29; 16 and 17 Victoria, chapter 67; 17 and 18 Victoria, chapter 91; 19 and 20 Victoria, chapter 103; 20 and 21 Victoria, chapter 58; 22 and 23 Victoria, chapters 8, 56 and 66; 23 and 24 Victoria, chapter 146; 24 and 25 Victoria, chapter 153; 25 and 26 Victoria, chapters 35, 62 and 101; 27 and 28 Victoria, chapter 26; 30 and

31 Victoria, chapters 80 and 101; 31 and 32 Victoria, chapter 102; 32 and 33 Victoria, chapter 70; "The Aberdeen Police and Waterworks Act, 1862;" "The General Police and Improvement (Scotland) Supplemental Act, 1866;" "The Aberdeen Police and Waterworks Amendment Act, 1867;" "The Aberdeenshire Roads Acts, 1865;" "The Aberdeen County and Municipal Buildings Act, 1866;" "The Aberdeen Town Council Act, 1868;" "The Aberdeen Harbour Act, 1868;" "The Great North of Scotland Railway (Amalgamation) Act, 1866;" and "The Great North of Scotland Railway (Further Powers) Act, 1867."

(Additional Supply of Water ; power to draw same from St. Mary's Loch and the Loch of the Lowes, and New Works for that purpose : Repeal, Amendment, and Alteration of Acts ; New and increased Rates ; Additional Powers to Borrow ; and other Purposes.)

And by the said Bill power will be taken to alter, amend, and in part repeal the provisions of the said "Edinburgh and District Water-works Act 1869," and of the existing Acts of the Edinburgh Water Company, or some of the provisions of such Acts, *videlicet*—"The Edinburgh Water Company's Act 1856," and "The Edinburgh Water Company's Amendment Act, 1863," including any portions of the previous Acts of Parliament of the said Edinburgh Water Company which may be reserved, and remain unrepealed (that is to say), of the following Acts (Local) :—The Act of 59 Geo. III., cap. 116 ; 7 Geo. IV., cap. 108 ; 5 Will. IV., cap. 33 ; 6 and 7 Vict., cap. 89 ; 10 and 11 Vict., cap. 202 ; and 16 Vict., cap. 49.

And by the Bill power will be taken—in order to the introduction of such additional supply of Water for the said city, towns, port, district, and places adjacent, from Saint Mary's Loch and the Loch of the Lowes, situated as aforesaid, and for the purpose of affording a supply of Water to the parties interested in the Waters flowing from the said Lochs into the said River or Water of Yarrow, which flows into the River or Water of Etrick, which last-mentioned River or Water is discharged into the River Tweed—to impound, take, and draw off the water of the said Saint Mary's Loch and of the Loch of the Lowes and River or Water of Yarrow above the embankment first after described, to the depth, and to raise and maintain the level of the same to the height shown on the sections after mentioned, or to such other depth or height as may be authorised by the Bill ; and for effectuating the said purpose, power will be taken to construct, erect, and maintain the works following, *viz.*—*First*, An Embankment commencing at a point 55 yards or

thereby south of the Main Road leading from Moffat to Selkirk, where such road is joined by the road leading to Dryhope House, and extending across the River and Valley of the Yarrow in a south-easterly direction for 290 yards or thereby from its commencement, and there terminating, which embankment will be situated in the Parish of Yarrow and County of Selkirk aforesaid. *Second*, A Cut or Channel between the said Loch of the Lowes and Saint Mary's Loch, commencing in the Loch of the Lowes at a point 130 yards or thereby south of the point where the Oxcleuch Burn enters the said last mentioned Loch, in the parish of Etrick and County of Selkirk, and terminating at a point in Saint Mary's Loch 120 yards or thereby north of a point in the middle of the stream which flows from the Loch of the Lowes to Saint Mary's Loch, where the stream enters the said last mentioned Loch in the parish of Yarrow and County of Selkirk aforesaid. *Third*, An Aqueduct, Conduit, or Pipe, commencing in Saint Mary's Loch aforesaid at a point 100 yards or thereby west of the point where the Kirkstead Burn enters the said Loch, measuring from the middle of the said Burn, in the Parish of Yarrow and County of Selkirk, and terminating at the south-west corner of the proposed reservoir after mentioned at or near to the Village of Straiton, in the Parish of Liberton and County of Edinburgh, at a point at a distance of 150 yards or thereby measuring in a westerly direction along the road to Broomhill Cottage from a point on the west side of the Edinburgh and Penicuik Turnpike road, where the road to Loanhead leaves the said Turnpike road at the Village of Straiton ; which Aqueduct, Conduit, or Pipe will pass from, through, or into the said Parish of Yarrow, in the County of Selkirk, the Parishes of Traquair, Innerleithen, Peebles, Eddleston, and Newlands, and the Royal Burgh of Peebles, respectively, or some of them, in the County of Peebles, and the Parishes of Penicuik, Glencorse and Lasswade, respectively, or some of them, and the said Parish of Liberton in the County of Edinburgh ; together with a Cut or Channel from the said Aqueduct, Conduit, or Pipe for the conveyance of compensation water to the channel of the River Yarrow, leaving the said Aqueduct, Conduit, or Pipe at a point 700 yards or thereby westward from the turnpike road bridge over the Douglas Burn, measured along the said road, and proceeding in an easterly direction, and terminating in the bed or channel of the said River Yarrow, which cut or channel will be situated in the parish of Yarrow and county of Selkirk aforesaid. *Fourth*, A Reservoir, to be situated at the termination of the Aqueduct, Conduit, or Pipe, thirdly before described, at or near the village of Straiton, aforesaid, in the Parish of Liberton, and County of Edinburgh, within which parish the said Reservoir will be situated, and commencing at a point on the west side of the Turnpike road from Edinburgh to Penicuik where the road to Broomhill Cottage leaves the said road near the junction of the Edinburgh and Penicuik and Loanhead roads at the said village of Straiton, and extending in a westerly direction along the road to Broomhill Cottage for a distance of 150 yards or thereby, and in a northerly direction to a point 100 yards or thereby along the Turnpike road towards Burdiehouse, both as measured from the point first mentioned, and extending in a westerly direction from the point on the west side of the said Turnpike road to a point at a distance of 150 yards or thereby, and

And Notice is also given, that by the operations aforesaid, water will be diverted into the intended Aqueducts, Conduits, Reservoirs, and other works of the Trustees from the said Lochs, which water flows at present into the Rivers Yarrow and Ettrick and Tweed, and from the following Cuts, Aqueducts, and Works into which the said water now flows or is conveyed, namely,—the mill-dams, leads, and tailraces of the following mills,—Deuchar corn mill, in the parish of Yarrow; Philipbaugh saw and woollen mills, Selkirk flour mill, Forest woollen mills, Ettrick woollen mills, and Dunsdale woollen mills, all in the parish of Selkirk; Linlean meal and flour mill, in the parish of Galashiels; Melrose flour mill, and Newstead flour mill, both in the parish of Melrose; Mertoun meal and flour mill, in the parish of Mertoun; Rutherford flour mill, in the parish of Maxton; Kelso flour mill and Wooden woollen mill, both in the parish of Kelso; Banff corn mill, in the parish of Spronston; Sharpitlaw saw mill, in the parish of Ednam; and Tweed flour mill in the parish of Lennel; collecting well, tank, or reservoir, and pipes with lead therewith connected, forming the water-works of the town of Selkirk; aqueduct or water-pipe for supply of the town of Kelso; and all or any other cuts, aqueducts or other works, deriving water from the said lochs and rivers, including the sluice and aqueduct at the mouth of St Mary's Loch, and the water channels in the bed of the river Yarrow, connected therewith.

And it is intended, and power will be taken, by the Bill to make and maintain such Embankments, Dams, Weirs, Channels, Sluices, Gauges, and other works and conveniences as may be necessary for impounding and taking the Waters of the said Saint Mary's Loch and the Loch of the Lowes and River Yarrow, above the embankment first before

described, and for regulating the flow therefrom; and for determining and ascertaining the quantity of Water to be supplied to the parties interested in the waters of the said Lochs and Rivers of Yarrow and Ettrick and Tweed, and also to make and maintain all other Embankments, Weirs, Dams, Sluices, Gauges, Pipes, Cuts, Channels, Tunnels, diversions of Streams, and of Roads, and all other works necessary for carrying out the objects of the Bill, or any of them, and the works to be authorised. And provision will also be made, if necessary or expedient, for compensating parties from whom water may be abstracted, or whose interests may be otherwise prejudiced by the operations of the Trustees, or some of them, in such other way and manner as may be agreed on, or suitable and convenient.

And power will be taken to deviate in the construction of the said several works from the lines and levels delineated on the plans and sections to be deposited as after-mentioned, and in the area of the land to be submerged and used or a quired, to the extent defined on the plans and specified in the Bill; and power will also be taken to carry the Conduits, Pipes, and other Works, or any of them through, over, under, along, across, or into, and for that purpose, temporarily or permanently to stop up, divert, or alter any Turnpike Road, Public Highway, Statute Labour, or other Road, Street, Canal, Railway, Tramway, Bridge, Stream, Sewer, or Drain, in any of the Parishes within which the Works to be authorised will be situated as aforesaid, or the supply of Water be afforded. And power will also be taken to the Trustees to acquire, compulsorily or by agreement, all Lands, Houses, and other property necessary for the execution of the Works to be authorised, including the Water to be abstracted from the said Saint Mary's Loch and Loch of the Lowes, and River Yarrow above the embankment first described, and solum of the said Lochs and River respectively, if necessary, and ground to be submerged as aforesaid, and also to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges connected with such Lands, Houses, Lochs, Waters, and other Property which may in any way interfere with the purposes of the Bill, or with the discontinuance of works that may be superseded under powers in the said Bill, or with the existing works and property of the Trustees, or any portion of them, and generally all rights and privileges conferred by, or in relation to, the provisions of the Acts before and after recited, or any of them, which it may be expedient to vary or extinguish, and also to confer new powers, rights, and privileges, and specially, but without prejudice to the generality of such notice, all powers, rights, and privileges, conferred on the River Tweed Commissioners, which would interfere with the proposed works, will be altered and repealed; and "The Tweed Fisheries Act, 1857," and "Tweed Fisheries Amendment Act, 1859," will, so far as may be necessary, be amended, and all powers, rights, and privileges conferred on the Bailies, Council, and community of Selkirk, by an Act of the Parliament of Scotland, dated 28th June 1633, and the Royal Charters thereby ratified, or by any

other Act or Charter, so far as they may obstruct the objects of the Bill, will be also extinguished.

And power will be taken to the Trustees to maintain and use their existing pipes and works, and to lay new and additional pipes, and make and maintain such additional works as may be necessary for the distribution of the supply of Water to be afforded under the Bill, and power will also be taken to discontinue and sell and dispose of any existing works and property which may be superfluous or superseded by the works to be authorised.

And it is intended by the said Bill to define the area of supply of Water by the Trustees from the existing sources, and from those sources which they will be authorised by the Bill to appropriate, which area shall include and comprehend as follows—that is to say, the municipal and police areas of Edinburgh, Leith (including the Port thereof), and Portobello respectively, with all parishes within such areas wholly or partially, and all parishes next adjoining such parishes, and all places and districts at present supplied by the Trustees, or such lesser area as shall be fixed by Parliament, and to adopt the existing area of compulsory supply, or to define to what larger portion of the whole area above described, the supply shall be compulsory, and to what portion of the same the supply shall be conditional or voluntary and by agreement. And the Trustees will be empowered, within such whole area, to supply Water for domestic and all other purposes, including the extinction of fires, and for public wells, fountains, baths, and wash-houses, and for cleansing and flushing streets, squares, lanes, and closes, sewers and drains, and for manufacturing, shipping, and all police, public, and sanitary purposes. And power will be conferred on the Trustees to enter into agreements with the local authorities or other persons for supply of the water to such towns, places, and districts beyond the said area of supply, as may desire a supply, for such price or other consideration and on such conditions as may be agreed on.

And it is also intended to take power to levy the rates, duties, or rents now leviable by the Trustees, or to alter such rates, duties, or rents, and to repeal the same in whole or in part, and to levy, if necessary, new additional and increased rates, duties, or rents, limited or unlimited in amount, for or in respect of the supply and use of the Water, of whatsoever kind, and to levy from the owners and occupiers, or one or other of them, of all lands and heritages within the area of supply, or within the area of compulsory supply, or of all lands and heritages liable in Police or Sanitary Rates within such area of supply, or of compulsory supply, such public rate as shall be necessary, or of appropriating to the purposes of the Trust from the Police Funds and Revenues of the City and Towns to be supplied, or from the Police Funds and Revenues of such of the said City and Towns as may be expedient, such annual payment in lieu or aid of such public rate as may be equitable, and as may be sanctioned by Parliament, and for that purpose, and so far as necessary, to alter and amend the provisions or some of them, of the following Acts of Parliament, or of some or one or other of them—that is to say, the following Local Acts:—“The Edinburgh Police Act, 1848,” “The Edinburgh Police Amendment Act, 1854,” “The Edinburgh Municipality Extension Act, 1856,” and the following Public General Acts, viz:—The Act 23

and 24 Vict., cap. 50; the Act 24 and 25 Vict., cap. 27; “The Edinburgh Provisional Order Confirmation Act, 1867” (including the Edinburgh Provisional Order thereby confirmed), “The Municipal Rate (Edinburgh) Act 1868” and the Act of 33 and 34 Vict., cap. 87, “The Leith Municipal and Police Act, 1848,” (Local), and the Act (Public General) of 26 and 27 Vict., cap. 60, with the Provisional Order thereby confirmed as to the Town of Leith, and the Public General Act of 13 and 14 Vict., cap. 33, in so far as the same has been adopted and is in operation within the Town of Portobello. And power will be taken to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of rates, rents, and duties, and other rights and privileges.

And to enable the Trustees to accomplish the objects of the Bill, powers will be taken to them to borrow, with such preference as may be equitable, such additional sums as may be necessary for the purpose of the Bill, on the security of the rates, duties, rents, income, and the general property of the Trust, by mortgage, bond, cash credit, terminable annuity, or otherwise, and in such form as is provided in the said "Edinburgh and District Water-works Act, 1869," or otherwise as may be expedient; and power will also be taken to fund the debts of the Trust.

GLASGOW AND SOUTH WESTERN RAILWAY.

(Abandonment of certain authorized Railways in Ayrshire; Application of Capital; Vesting Undertaking of Ayr and Maybole Junction Railway Company; Further Money for payment for Paisley Canal Debts and Shares; Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is Hereby Given, that the Glasgow and South Western Railway Company (hereinafter called "the Company") intend to apply to Parliament in the ensuing Session for an Act for all or some of the following purposes:

To Authorize the Commissioners to Manufacture Gas on the several Lands before described, belonging to the Old Company and the New Company respectively, or on any part or parts thereof, and the several matters producible from the Residual Products arising or resulting from the manufacture of Gas, and generally to carry on the Operations and Works which are carried on by Corporations and Companies who Manufacture and Supply Gas for Public and Private lighting; and to Sell and Supply Gas for Public and Private purposes, and to light with Gas all Places within the Boundaries of the Royal Burgh of Perth, as these are defined and set forth in a Deliverance made by the Sheriff of Perthshire dated the twenty-fourth, and recorded in the Sheriff-Court Books of Perthshire, the twenty-seventh, both days of August, in the year Eighteen hundred and Sixty-six, under the provisions of "The General Police and Improvement (Scotland) Act, 1862," or such part or parts thereof as may be prescribed by the Bill; and also those parts of the Parish of Perth, East Church Parish of Perth, West Church Parish of Perth, Middle Church Parish of Perth, St Paul's Church Parish of Perth, St Leonard's Church Parish of Perth, Parish of Scone, Parish of Kin-noull, and Parish of Tibbermuir, all within the County of Perth, or of some of them, so far as not within the Boundaries of the Royal Burgh of Perth, as fixed by the Deliverance of the Sheriff of Perthshire before-mentioned, or such part or parts thereof as may be defined by the Bill; and within all or any part of the said limits to Sell and Supply Gas for Lighting Streets, Places, Houses, Buildings, and Premises, or other Private or Public Places and Property; and to Enter into and Make Agreements relative thereto, and to Authorize the Commissioners within those limits, or any part thereof, to Break up, and interfere with, and to Cross, and Pass under or Over, Streets, Turnpike or other Roads, Railways, Highways, or other Public Passages and Places, Bridges, Rivers, Waters, Sewers, and Drains and Pipes therein, and to lay down and maintain Gas Mains, Gas Pipes, Lamps, Pillars, and Posts, and to Manufacture, Supply, Hire, Sell, or Let Gas Meters, Fittings, and Gas Apparatus, and to hold and acquire Patent-rights or Licenses, to use Patent-rights in relation to the Manufacture or Distribution of Gas and the Utilization of Residual Products.

VIII. To Authorize the Commissioners to Levy, Recover, and Collect, Rates, Rents, and Charges, for the Supply of Gas, and for the Sale and Use of Meters, Fittings, and other Matters, and things Supplied or Sold by them; and from time to time to Alter such Rates, Rents, and Charges; as also, to Levy Special Rates and Assessments and Guarantee Rates and Assessments on and from the Occupiers of all Lands, Houses, and Heritages, within the said Boundaries of the said Royal Burgh of Perth, or such parts thereof, as shall be defined in the Bill, for carrying into effect the several objects of the Bill, or some of them, and specially for meeting any deficiency that may arise in any one or more years in the Income of the Commissioners to meet the Expenditure, and to grant Exemptions from the Payment of such Rates, Assessments, Rents, and Charges.
