IN virtue of the powers contained in the Prisons (Scotland) Administration Act, 1860, I do hereby order and intimate that the PRISON of CROMARTY, within the Sheriffdom of Ross, Cromarty, and Sutherland, shall, on and after the 15th day of February 1872, cease to be a Legal Prison.

Given under my hand and seal, at Whitehall, the 17th day of January 1872, in the 35th year of Her Majesty's reign.
