#### EUROPEAN SOCIETY ARBITRATION.

5. Each policy on which a claim is allowed against the European Society shall be valued as on 12 January 1872 being the day of the date of the Order to wind up that

6. A claim shall not be received against the Wellington Society unless the claimant first pays every premium which fell due and became payable in respect thereof before 8 April 1873.

7. A claim shall not be received against the British Nation Association unless the claimant first pays every premium which fell due and became payable in respect thereof before 18 January 1872.
