WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, dated the 29th day of January 1874, the provisions for the prevention of diseases contained in Part III. of the Act 30 and 31 Vict., c. 101, are continued in force in Scotland for the space of three calendar months after the 29th day of January 1874:

Therefore, exercising the powers conferred upon them by the 33d section of the foresaid Statute, and continued in operation by the said Order of Council, the Board of Supervision renew the directions and regulations issued by them on the 30th day of July 1873; and continue the same in force, unless revoked or altered, for the space of three calendar months after the 29th day of January 1874.
