VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Wednesday the sixteenth day of December instant, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and deelare, that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Friday the fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Friday the fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventyfive, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Friday the fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.
