## BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS

MADE BY

### THE GLASGOW TRAMWAY AND OMNIBUS COMPANY (LIMITED).

Lessees of the Glasgow Street Tramways under a lease between the said Company and the Corporation of Glasgow, dated 16th and 17th November 1871.

Under the Powers conferred on the Company by 'The Tramways Act, 1870.'

1. **T**HE Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all the Carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

2. Every Passenger shall enter or depart from a Carriage by the nearside of the hindermost or Conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No Passenger shall Smoke inside any Carriage, or on either platform.

4. A Person in a state of Intoxication shall not knowingly be allowed to enter or mount upon any Carriage, and if found in or upon any Carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

5. No Person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any Carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any Carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any Passenger.

6. No Person shall cut, tear, soil, or damage the Cushions or the Linings, or remove or deface any Number Plate, Printed Notice, or Writing on the Panels, Roofs or Windows, or break or scratch any Window of or otherwise damage any Carriage. Any Person acting in contravention of this Regulation, shall be liable to the Penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of damage done.

7. A Person whose Dress or Clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor of a Carriage, soil or injure the Linings or Cushions of the Carriage, or the Dress or Clothing of any Passenger, or a Person who, in the opinion of the Conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to Passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any Carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any Carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any Carriage after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor; and if found in the interior of any Carriage shall, when requested by the Conductor, leave the interior of the Carriage.

8. Each Passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the Conductor, or other duly authorised Officer of the Company, the full Fare legally demanded for the distance he intends to travel and accept a Ticket corresponding thereto, and Passengers travelling by the Cars marked 'Through Cars,' must on entering the same, accept a Ticket for the entire distance the Car has yet to run to

its destination, and pay the Fare legally demanded for that distance.

9. Each Passenger shall show his Ticket at any time during his journey, and when required so to do, deliver it up to the Conductor or Inspector, or any duly authorised Servant of the Company. Any passenger failing or refusing to accept, to show or deliver up his Ticket as aforesaid, shall be required to pay the Fare from the place where the Carriage by which such Passenger is conveyed started on that journey to the point of destination of such Passenger, and in default of payment thereof is hereby subjected to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings, and may be summarily removed from the Carriage.

10. Personal luggage exceeding in the total twenty-eight pounds in weight shall not be carried by any Passenger—unless permitted by the Conductor, when each parcel exceeding this weight shall be charged for, and a ticket obtained by the owner or custodian as for a Passenger. No Passenger's luggage shall be allowed on either Platform.

11. No Passenger or other Person, not being a Servant of the Company, shall be permitted to travel on the Steps or Platform of any Carriage, or stand either on the Roof or the Interior, or sit on the outside Rail on the Roof of any Carriage, and any Passenger so doing shall cease to do so immediately at the request of the Conductor.

12. No Person, except a Passenger or intending Passenger, shall enter or mount any Carriage, and no Person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any Carriage or travel therein, otherwise than on a seat provided for Passengers.

13. When any Carriage contains the full number of Passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional Person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such Carriage when warned by the Conductor not to do so.

14. No Person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any Carriage whilst in motion.

15. No Dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any Carriage.

16. No Person shall travel in or on any Carriage of the Company with loaded Fire Arms.

17. No Passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Officer or Servant of the Company in the Execution of his Duty, upon or in connection with any Carriage or Tramway of the Company.

18. The Conductor of each Carriage shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability, and if any such Conductor fails to enforce the same as aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a Breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

19. Any Person offending against or committing a Breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall be liable to a Penalty not exceeding FORTY SHILLINGS.

20. The expression 'Conductor,' shall include any Officer or Servant in the employment of the Company having charge of a Carriage.

21. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each Carriage in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

22. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of May 1875.
