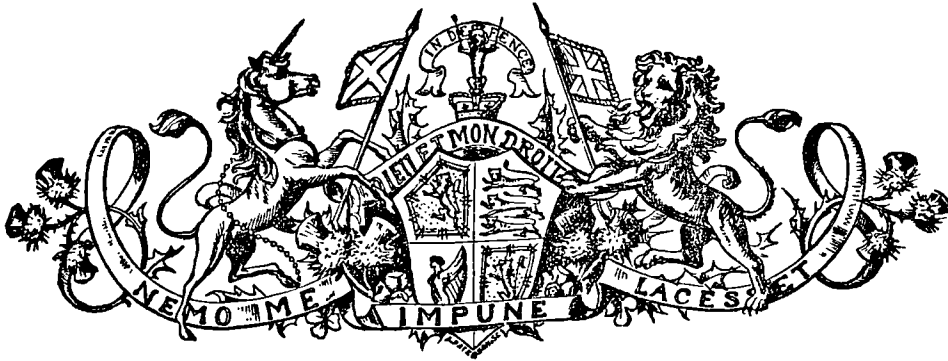

By the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education in Scotland.

THE Lords of the Committee of Privy Council on Education in Scotland, by virtue and in pursuance of the powers in them vested under the Education (Scotland) Act, 1872, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and is hereby ordered as follows—

With respect the Triennial Election of a School Board :

1. Every existing School Board shall remain in office until a new election shall take place.

2. The number of Members of the new School Board shall be the number determined in the case of the first election by the Board of Education ; unless such number may have been changed by any order of the Scotch Education Department, which has been communicated to the School Board one month before the triennial election.

3. The election shall be held upon some convenient day to be fixed by the School Board, provided that such day of election shall be not more than ten clear days before, or twenty clear days after, the same day of the year as that which was fixed for the first election of the School Board.

4. The Returning Officer shall be the Chairman of the School Board, or failing him, some person appointed by the School Board.

No candidate for election may act as Returning Officer.

5. The electors shall consist of all persons being

of lawful age, and not subject to any legal incapacity, whose names are entered on the latest valuation roll applicable to the parish or burgh for which the Board is to be elected, made up and completed not less than one month prior to the election, as owners or occupiers of lands or heritages of the annual value of not less than four pounds, situated within such parish or burgh.

6. Fifteen clear days at least before the day fixed for the election, the Returning Officer shall prepare, sign, and publish such notice of the election as is hereinafter prescribed.

7. The notice shall specify the number of Members to be elected, with the day fixed for the election ; and shall also specify a place for the reception of the nomination papers hereinafter mentioned.

The notice shall be in the form annexed to this order, or to the like effect.

8. After publication of the notice, but not less than eleven clear days before the day fixed for the election, any two electors may nominate as a candidate any person of full age, by sending to, or delivering at, the appointed place, a nomination paper, subscribed by such two electors as aforesaid, and stating the Christian name and surname, with the place of abode and designation, of each subscriber, and of the candidate nominated ; and the Returning Officer shall send, forthwith, notice of such nomination to each candidate.

No Teacher of a Public or State-aided School is eligible as member of a School Board.

9. No nomination paper shall be received after four o'clock in the afternoon of the last day upon which such paper may be received, and no person shall be a candidate unless he has been nomi-

nated within the time and in the manner aforesaid.

The Returning Officer shall decide whether any nomination is valid, and his decision shall be final.

10. Eight clear days at least before the day fixed for the election, the names, places of abode, and designations, of the several candidates nominated as aforesaid shall be published by the Returning Officer.

11. After delivery of a nomination paper, but not less than six clear days before the day fixed for the election, any candidate may be withdrawn by the delivery at the place appointed, of a notice of such withdrawal, addressed to the Returning Officer, and signed by the candidate.

Such notice shall be delivered not later than four o'clock in the afternoon of the last day on which it may be received.

12. If the number of candidates, nominated and not withdrawn as aforesaid, shall equal, but not exceed, the number of members to be elected, such candidates shall be deemed to be elected on the day fixed for the election, and the Returning Officer shall on that day publish a list of the names, with the places of abode and designations, of the persons so elected, and such publication shall be conclusive evidence of the election.

13. If the number of candidates, nominated and not withdrawn as aforesaid, shall be less than the number to be elected, but sufficient to constitute a quorum of the School Board, the Returning Officer shall, on the day fixed for the election, declare such candidates to be duly elected, and shall publish a list of the names, with the places of abode and designations, of the persons so elected; and they shall, at their first meeting, nominate and appoint as many persons to be members of the School Board as shall be necessary to make up the full number of members, and shall give notice of such appointment to the Scotch Education Department, and to the Board of Education.

If the number of candidates so nominated, and not withdrawn, shall not be sufficient to constitute a quorum, the Returning Officer shall report to the Scotch Education Department that no election has taken place.

Three members constitute a quorum of a School Board.

14. If after the time hereinbefore limited for the withdrawal of any candidate, more persons remain as candidates than there are members to be elected, the Returning Officer shall forthwith publish the names, places of abode, and designations of the several candidates, and give notice that a poll will be taken on the day fixed for the election, between the hours specified in such notice.

15. The School Board shall determine the number and situation of the polling-stations, and for the purposes of this election, may cause their district to be divided into polling divisions. The Returning Officer shall cause the boundaries of such divisions, and the number and situation of the polling-stations, to be published not less than three clear days before the day fixed for the election.

No public-house shall be used for a polling-station, or for the purposes of an election.

16. If the district of a School Board is divided into polling divisions, each voter shall give his vote in the polling division in which the property in respect of which he is entitled to vote is situate,

and if it is situate in more than one such division, he shall vote in any one of the divisions in which it is situate.

17. The Returning Officer, or some person or persons appointed by him for this purpose, shall preside at each polling-station, provided that only one person shall preside at the same time.

18. The poll shall be open,

(a) In a Burgh, during the hours prescribed for municipal elections.

(b) In a Parish, during not less than six, nor more than eight, hours, from such hour not later than 12 o'clock noon, to such hour not later than 6 P.M., as the School Board may fix.

19. Subject to the provisions of this order, the poll shall be taken,

(a) In a Burgh, in like manner as a poll at a contested Municipal Election is directed by the Ballot Act, 1872, to be taken; and subject to this Order, the provisions of that Act shall apply to the Election of a School Board, with the substitution of the term 'School Board Election' for the term 'Municipal Election.'

(b) In a Parish, in the manner prescribed in the Schedule (A) annexed to this Order.

20. In case of an equality of votes, the Returning Officer shall determine the person to be elected.

21. The Returning Officer shall publish notice of the result of the poll and of the names, with the places of abode and designations, of the persons elected.

22. The Returning Officer shall, in every case transmit to the Scotch Education Department, and to the Board of Education, a copy of the list which he publishes, showing the result of the Election.

23. The Returning Officer shall deliver the Ballot Papers in a sealed cover to the Clerk of the School Board, to be kept among the records of the Board, subject to the direction of the Scotch Education Department.

24. Notice of the election of a person to be a member of a School Board shall be sent to that person by the Returning Officer, together with a notice to attend the first Meeting of the School Board, at a place and time to be prescribed before the election by the School Board; and that time shall be not later than fourteen days after the date of the election.

25. The expenses incident to the election (but not including the expenses of any candidate) shall be paid by the School Board out of the School Fund. Provided that if any question shall arise as to such expenses, such question shall be referred to the Scotch Education Department, whose decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

26. Notices and other matters required by these regulations to be published, shall be published.

(a) In a Burgh, by advertisement in the local newspapers, or in such other manner as public notices are usually published.

(b) In a Parish, by being affixed to the doors of the Parish Church, and of all other places of worship, and of all Public or State-aided Schools within the parish.

27. When the Board of Education shall have decided that any Burgh or Town for which a School Board has been elected, shall cease to have a separate School Board, and shall be included in the area of the Parish in which it is situated, then

the Returning Officer (failing the Chairman of the School Board for the Parish) shall be appointed, and the time and place for the Election of the General School Board shall be fixed, at a joint meeting of the Parish and Burgh School Boards.

3. Every person of lawful age, and not subject to any legal incapacity, whose name is entered on the valuation roll, dated the _____ day of _____ 187, as owner or occupier of lands or heritages of the annual value of not less than four pounds is entitled to vote in the election.

4. Any two Electors may nominate any person of full age as a Candidate, by sending to or delivering at (some place to be specified), a nomination paper.

The nomination paper must be dated and subscribed by the two Electors, and must contain the Christian names, surnames, places of abode, and designations of the subscribers, and of the Candidate nominated.

No nomination paper will be received after four o'clock in the afternoon of the _____ day of _____

5. Public notice will be given of the list of Candidates on or before the _____ day of _____

6. Any Candidate may be withdrawn by the delivery (at some place to be specified), not later than four o'clock in the afternoon of the _____ day of _____ of a notice of withdrawal signed by the Candidate, and addressed to the Returning Officer.

7. The voting will take place in each polling-division, and notice of the number and situation of the polling-stations will be published on or before the _____ day of _____

Each voter must vote in the division in which the property in respect of which he is rated is situate, and if it is situated in more than one division, in any one of the divisions in which it is situate.

8. The poll will be open from _____ A.M. till _____ P.M.

9. The voting shall be by ballot.

10. Each voter has _____ votes, all or some of which he may distribute among the Candidates as he sees fit.

SCHEDULE A.

RULES AND DIRECTIONS FOR TAKING VOTES IN PARISHES.

1. *Preparations for Poll.*—The Returning Officer shall provide a Ballot Box so constructed that a ballot paper can be introduced therein, but cannot be withdrawn without the box being unlocked; a sufficient number of printed ballot papers, containing in the form annexed the names of the Candidates; materials for the marking of the votes on the ballot papers, sealing wax, and a copy of the Valuation Roll of the Parish or School District; and shall cause one compartment or more to be fitted up in the polling place, in which the voter shall be screened from observation while marking his ballot paper. Provided that in any Parish situated in the Counties of Argyll, Inverness, Ross and Cromarty, and Orkney and Shetland, the Returning Officer may use written ballot papers, in the form hereinafter described.

The Returning Officer should make a uniform private mark on all the ballot papers issued, or adopt some other means to guard against the use of fraudulent papers.

2. *Persons entitled to attend at the Polling Place.*—The only persons entitled to be present within the polling place are the Returning Officer and his clerks, and the Candidates, or the persons whom they shall authorize in writing under their hand to represent them.

3. *Declaration of Secrecy.*—Before the opening of the poll, the Returning Officer and every person authorized to be present within the polling place, or at the counting of the votes, must have made before a Justice of the Peace the following declaration of secrecy:—

I solemnly promise and declare that I will not communicate except for some purpose authorized by law, any information as to the persons who have voted or not voted, or as to the candidates for whom any vote has been given, at the Election for a School Board in this Parish [or School District].

The Returning Officer shall not permit any person who has not made the above declaration of secrecy to attend within the polling place.

4. *Commencement of Poll.*—Before the commencement of the poll, the Returning Officer shall show the ballot box empty, to such persons as may be present, and then lock it up and seal it. He shall then place it near him, and keep it within his view.

5. *Mode of Voting.*—When any person comes up to vote, the Returning Officer shall ascertain that the person is entitled to vote; and if so, the Returning Officer shall deliver to the voter a ballot paper, call out his name and description as stated in the Valuation Roll, place against the name of the voter a mark, which will denote that the voter has received a ballot paper, but not denote the particular ballot paper which he has received.

The voter, having received his ballot paper, shall proceed at once to the compartment, and shall there, either in figures or by crosses, but not in written words, secretly insert opposite the names of the candidates for whom he votes the

number of votes he gives to each. He shall then fold up his ballot paper so as to conceal the figures or crosses which he has inserted, put the ballot paper, so folded, at once into the ballot box, and immediately leave the polling place.

6. *Order within the Polling Place.*—The Returning Officer shall make arrangements for preserving order within the polling place; and shall regulate the admission of electors, so that those voting shall not be liable to be overlooked or otherwise put to inconvenience; and shall see that each voter retires immediately after giving his vote.

7. *Validity of Votes.*—Any ballot paper on which more votes are given than the voter is entitled to give, or on which anything is written or marked by which the voter can be identified, shall be invalid and not counted.

8. *Proceedings at Close of Poll.*—Immediately after the time fixed for the close of the poll, the Returning Officer, in presence of the candidates or the persons authorized to represent them, shall break the seal, open the box, examine the ballot papers, and record the number of votes for each candidate. He shall then make up the whole of the ballot papers into a packet, and shall write on the outside of the packet a description of its contents, the date of the election, and the name of the School Board, and shall seal up and deliver the same to the Clerk of the School Board, to be kept among the records of the Board, subject to the direction of the Scotch Education Department.

9. *Proceedings where there is more than one Polling Place.*

- (a) If there be more than one polling place appointed for a Parish or School District, the Returning Officer shall appoint for each polling place a Presiding Officer, who shall conduct the taking of the votes in all respects in conformity with the foregoing rules.
- (b) The Returning Officer shall deliver to the Presiding Officer, along with the other necessary materials for voting, a certified list, taken from the Valuation Roll, of the persons entitled to vote at each polling place.
- (c) At the close of the poll, in the presence of the candidates, or the persons authorized to represent them, the Presiding Officer shall seal with his own seal, and the seals of such candidates as desire to affix their seals, the ballot box in use at his polling place unopened, but with the key attached, and shall deliver the box as soon as practicable to the Returning Officer.
- (d) The Returning Officer shall make arrangements for counting the votes in the several ballot boxes in the presence of the candidates, or the persons authorized to represent them, as soon as practicable after the close of the poll, and shall give to the candidates notice of the time and place at which he will begin to count the same.
- (e) Before beginning to count the votes, the Returning Officer shall, in the presence of the candidates, or the persons authorized to represent them, open the ballot boxes, and then mix together the whole of the ballot papers contained in the ballot boxes.
