THE Earl of Derby, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, dated June 8, 1877:—

'I am informed officially by the Turkish Government that torpedoes having been placed in the Bay of Suda, in Crete, the entrance to it at night has been prohibited to all vessels of war and of commerce. No guns must be fired by vessels on their arrival at night. A Turkish man-of-war is on guard at the entrance.'
