TREATY of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Italy.

Declaration signed at Rome, December 17, 1877.

**W**HEREAS the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Italy of 6th August 1863, would cease to be in force on the 31st December 1877, in consequence of a denunciation made by the Italian Government, and the two Governments having recognised the utility of prolonging its duration, the Under-signed, duly authorized to this effect, have agreed to declare as follows:—

The Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Italy of the 6th August 1863, will continue to remain in force until the 31st March 1878.

In faith of which they have signed the present Declaration, made in duplicate, and have affixed their seals.

Done at Rome on the 17th December 1877.
