REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE
HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE
OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT
ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to
attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace,
are requested to bring with them two large cards,

with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to
be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the
Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord
Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His
Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to
be presented, must leave, at the Lord Chamber-
lain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve
o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a
card with his name written thereon, and with the
name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he
is to be presented. In order to carry out the
existing regulations, that no presentation can be
made at a Levee excepting by a person actually
attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an
intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who
is to make the presentation, of his inten-
tion to be present, should accompany the pre-
sentation card above referred to, which will be
submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's appro-
bation. It is Her Majesty's command that no
presentations should be made at the Levee,
except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case
the names be *very distinctly written* upon the
cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in
order that there may be no difficulty in announcing
them to His Royal Highness.

reception of Company coming to Court at one
o'clock.

APPLICATION BY THE SCHOOL BOARD OF KININMONTH UNDER THE ENDOWED INSTITUTIONS (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1878: PUBLISHED BY ORDER OF THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE HOME DEPARTMENT.

TO the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Petition of the School Board of Kininmonth, Aberdeenshire, humbly sheweth—

That by the will of the late Mr. George Gordon, Farmer, Strichen, dated the 5th day of April 1858, his Trustees were required 'to pay yearly the interest of a sum of £200 towards the endowment of, and support of, the school at New Leeds, presently taught by Miss Leslie, unless or until circumstances shall or may appear to my said Trustees to render the keeping up of such school unnecessary, in which case I ordain my said Trustees either to pay the said yearly interest to any school which supplies the wants of the New Leeds district, or at once permanently to invest the said sum of £200 for the benefit of such school, if they are afforded a reasonable guarantee of its permanence and efficiency.'

That the said school at New Leeds has been discontinued; and that village being included in the School District of Kininmonth, the educational wants of New Leeds are now supplied by the Public School of Kininmonth:

That the Trustees of the late Mr. George Gordon have accordingly invested the said sum of £200, with the interest which had accrued to it, for the benefit of the Public School of Kininmonth:

But that, since the support of said Public School of Kininmonth is already provided for by a rate under the Education (Scotland) Act of 1872, in the judgment of your petitioners, said endowment might be advantageously applied to the fostering of Higher Education:

That, therefore, at a meeting of the School Board of Kininmonth, specially called for the purpose at a month's notice, and held in the school on Tuesday the 25th day of March 1879, it was resolved, and carried by a majority of those present, 'That it is expedient that provision should be made for the better application of that portion of the Gordon Bequest which is under the administration of this Board; and that an application should be made to the Secretary of State for a Provisional Order under the Endowed Institutions (Scotland) Act, 1878.'

That, at the same meeting, the following scheme for the better application of said endowment was approved by a majority of the Board:—

It is proposed that the sum of eleven pounds sterling, or thereby, derived annually by Kininmonth School Board from the Gordon Bequest, shall henceforth be applied to promote Higher Education in Kininmonth Public School, and that for that purpose it shall be given in prizes according to the following scheme:—

1. There shall be offered annually two prizes of three guineas each and two prizes of two guineas each. (But the year in which the scheme comes first into operation, there shall be offered five prizes of two guineas each.)

2. These prizes shall be awarded to the highest competitors in an Examination open

to all pupils (male and female) of Kininmonth Public School who have passed the sixth standard according to the Education Code for Scotland, and who are resident within the bounds of the School district; but the higher prizes can be competed for only by those who have taken a lower prize at a previous Examination.

3. The Examination shall be held annually in the beginning of June; it shall be conducted by Examiners appointed by the School Board; and it shall embrace the whole range of 'Special Subjects' which have been taught in the School for the past year.

4. The revenue left after bestowing these prizes shall be allowed to accumulate until it is sufficient to form an additional lower prize; and if, in any year, one or both of the higher prizes should not be competed for, or if in the judgment of the Examiners none of the competitors should be worthy of these prizes, the sum thus arising shall also be laid aside to form additional lower prizes next year.

That at said Meeting of School Board of Kininmonth, it was further resolved that a Petition be presented to the Secretary of State setting out aforesaid resolution, and stating aforesaid provision for the better application of said Bequest; and the Reverend Thomas F. Whillas and Mr. John King, Members of the Board, were appointed a committee to draw up and present said Petition:

May it therefore please you to grant this application of the School Board of Kininmonth for a Provisional Order.
