INTIMATION is hereby given, in terms of an Interlocutor by the Lords of Council and Session, Commissioners for the Plantation of Kirks and Valuation of Teinds, dated 19th July 1880, and pursuant to the Statute 7th and 8th Victoria, cap. 44, that a Petition has been presented to their Lordships for and in name of ALEXANDER CORDINER, Fisherman, residing at Boddam, in the Parish of Peterhead, and Others, praying their Lordships, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Acts of Parliament therein recited, to Decern and Erect the Church at Boddam, in the Parish of Peterhead and Presbytery of Deer, into a PARISH CHURCH in connection with the Church of Scotland, and to Mark out and Designate the District specially set forth in the said Petition, which District is situated partly in the said Parish, and partly in the Parish of Cruden, in the Presbytery of Ellon, or such other District as their Lordships shall see fit, as the District to be attached *quoad sacra* to the said Church at Boddam; and to Disjoin such District *quoad sacra* from the Parishes of Peterhead and Cruden, to which the same now belongs; and to Erect such Church and District into a Parish Church and Parish *quoad sacra* in connection with the Church of Scotland, to be called THE CHURCH AND PARISH OF BODDAM; and to Find and Declare that the Minister and Elders of the said Church and Parish so to be erected shall have and enjoy the status, and all the powers, rights, and privileges of a Parish Minister and Elders of the Church of Scotland; and to Find and Declare that, upon the said Church at Boddam and District to be attached thereto being erected into a Parish Church and Parish *quoad sacra*, in terms of the foregoing cravings, the election and appointment of the Minister thereto shall be thereafter made in accordance with the provisions of the Act 37 and 38 Vict., cap. 82; but always under reservation of the right of the Presbytery of the bounds to present to the said Church *jure devoluto*, according to law, and as provided in the said Act of the 7th and 8th Victoria, cap. 44; and to Find, Decern, and Declare in the premises, in terms of the foregoing cravings, or in such other terms as to their Lordships shall seem meet, as the said Petition in itself more fully bears: And Intimation is hereby further given that, agreeably to the appointment in said Interlocutor, the Petitioners have lodged printed copies of the said Petition with the Session Clerks of the said Parishes of Peterhead and Cruden, with the Minister of Boddam Church, and with the Town Clerk of Peterhead, for the use of such parties interested as may apply for the same.
