The Civil Service Commissioners, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, hereby give notice that the following Clause is substituted for Clause 2 of the Amended General Regulations published in the London Gazette of the 20th September 1878, respecting Open Competitive Examinations for such situations in the Civil Service as are included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June 1870, viz. :—

2. These examinations will have reference either to the vacancies existing at the time of the examinations respectively, or to the number which may be estimated to occur within any period not exceeding six months after the commencement of the examinations, as may be laid down in Special Regulations, or in any Notice of such examina-

tions published, with the approval of the Lords of the Treasury, in the London Gazette.

And, further, that in Clause 5 of the same Regulations, the words 'no one of the successful Candidates' are substituted for the words 'no one of the selected Candidates,' and the words 'of selected Candidates' following the words 'on the list' are cancelled.
