#### WILSON'S CHARITY SCHOOL, KILMARNOCK.

Unto Her Majesty's Secretary of State, the Petition of the Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of the Burgh of Kilmarnock, and the Ministers of the Low and High Established Churches of Kilmarnock, the Governing Body of Wilson's Charity School,

*Humbly Sheweth,*

THAT John Wilson, sometime of Kilmarnock, thereafter of Ayr, Bookseller, by his Deed of Settlement, dated 11th June 1819, directed his Trustees, upon the deaths of certain parties, to dispose his one-fourth *pro indiviso* share of certain house property in Kilmarnock to the Magistrates and Town Council, the Ministers of the two Established Churches, and the Deacon Convener of Trade of Kilmarnock, for the purpose of founding in Kilmarnock a Charity School, to be called Wilson's Charity School. The present value of the share of said house property left by Mr. Wilson for the above purpose is about £350. The petitioners are directed to accumulate the rents until they are enabled to purchase up the remaining three-fourths of the property, after which they are still to accumulate the rents until they have sufficient to build a school house, after which the rents of the whole property are to be applied in the support of the school for the education of poor children.

The rents have been accumulating for about twenty years, and the endowment now amounts in value, including the fourth share of the property left by Mr. Wilson and a fourth share purchased by the Petitioners, to about £1100.

At a Meeting of the Governing Body specially called for the purpose on a month's notice, under the provisions of the Endowed Institutions (Scotland) Act, 1878, and held within the Town Hall of Kilmarnock on 7th July 1880, they unani-

mously resolved that, whereas the purpose of John Wilson's Trust was to make provision for the building and endowment of a school for the gratuitous education of poor children in reading, writing, and arithmetic,—a purpose which is now fulfilled by the Education (Scotland) Act, 1872,—there does not exist any further necessity for accumulating the revenues of the Trust. But in respect that it is proper they should be applied for the benefit of such persons as the testator directed to make beneficiaries under his Trust, it is expedient that the entire endowment, and the administration of the same, should be transferred to the Burgh School Board, now to be employed by them in providing free education for such children as they may consider suitable objects therefor, giving a preference to the children of the old inhabitants of the Town, in accordance with the Deed of the testator; and for this purpose that an application be made to the Secretary of State for a Provisional Order.

And the Petitioners have now to pray in accordance with said unanimous resolution that it may please the Secretary of State, after adopting such steps as he may in the circumstances consider proper, to issue a Provisional Order transferring the entire endowment and the administration thereof to said Burgh School Board, now to be employed by them in terms of said resolution.
