HER Majesty's Ambassador at Rome has announced that he has signed, this day, a Declaration by which the duration of the Commercial Treaty of the 6th of August 1863, between Great Britain and Italy, has been prolonged until the 31st of December 1881.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

**SPECIAL REGULATIONS** (Supplementary to the General Regulations, issued 8th April 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Indexing and Abridging Clerkships in the Patent Office.

*N.B.*—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for these situations are 21 and 25, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Competitive Examination.

II. At the Competitive Examinations exercises will be set in the following subjects only:—

1. Précis.
2. Geometry (Elementary and Practical).
3. Mechanical Drawing.
4. Mechanics and Mechanism.
5. Chemistry.
6. Electricity and Magnetism.
7. Hydrostatics, Hydraulics, and Pneumatics.

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in one of the subjects
