No. 2 ORDER OF 1881.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 27th day  
of April 1881.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable  
Privy Council.

PRESENT,

Lord President.

Mr. Mundella.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most  
Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and  
in exercise of the powers in them vested under  
The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878,  
and of every other power enabling them in this  
behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as  
follows:—

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND  
(MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 2 ORDER OF 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect  
from and immediately after the thirtieth day of  
April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one,  
and shall cease to have effect from and imme-  
diately after the thirty-first day of May one  
thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without  
prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any

proceeding in respect of an offence committed on  
or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning  
as in The Animals Order.

Prohibition of Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by  
water from any place or port in England or Wales  
to any place or port in Scotland.

Offences.

5. If an animal is moved in contravention of  
this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for  
the time being in charge thereof, and the person  
causing, directing, or permitting the movement,  
and the person or company moving or conveying  
the animal, and the owner and the charterer and  
the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and  
the consignee or other person receiving or keeping  
it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each  
according to and in respect of his or their own  
acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence  
against the Act of 1878.
