The Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the 'Albert Medal of the First Class' on— DAVID LOWSON, Esq., M.D., of Huddersfield.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 12th November 1880, Dr. Lowson, of Huddersfield, was called to attend Matilda Elizabeth Higginbottom, the child of Police Constable Higginbottom of that town, who was suffering from laryngeal diphtheria, when he performed the operation of tracheotomy. On the following morning, finding the child livid, and breathing with very great difficulty, and tracing that a large

quantity of mucus was accumulated in the trachea, he applied his lips to the wound, and, at imminent risk to his own life, afforded relief by suction. Throughout the day he continued to suck out mucus by means of a pipette. Notwithstanding this display of heroism, the child died on the third day after the operation. In the course of a few days Dr. Lowson was seized with a severe attack of diphtheria, followed by other dangerous illness, which resulted in his retirement from a lucrative practice.
