THIS day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that the Lords, authorised by virtue of his Majesty's Commission for declaring his Royal affent to several acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, Royal affent to the faid acts, was read accordingly,

A PROCLAMATION, FOR A PUBLIC THANKS GIVING. GEORGE R.

HEREAS by our proclamation of the twenty-fixth day of April last, we did appoint and command, that a General Thankfgiving to Almighty God should be observed throughout that part of our kingdom called Scotland, upon Tuesday the first day of June next: And whereas it hath been represented to us, that the faid day will be inconvenient for the celebration thereof, on account of the fitting us, that the faid day will be inconvenient for the celebration thereof, on account of the fitting of the General Affembly of the Church of Sectland: We therefore have thought sat, by the advice of our Privy Council, to iffue this our Royal proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that the said General Thanksgiving to Almighty God, be observed throughout that part of our kingdom called Scotland, upon Thursday the seventeenth day of June next, instead of Tuesday the first day of June next; And we do strictly charge and command, that the faid Public Thanksgiving be reverently and decently observed by all our loving subjects in Scotland, on the said seventeenth day of June next; as they tender the favour of Almighty

God, and would avoid his wrath and indignation, and upon pain of fuch punishment as we may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn or neglect the performance of fo religious a duty.

Given at our Court at St James's the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and two, in the forty-second year of our reign. God save the King.
