PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by 'The Sea Fisheries Act, 1868,' it is (among other things) enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to make, alter, and revoke regulations for carrying into execution the said Act and the intent and object thereof, and for the maintenance of good order among sea fishing boats and the persons belonging thereto:

And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council from time to time to do all or any of the following things, viz. :-

- (a.) To make regulations for carrying out, enforcing, and giving effect to both the entry and registry of British sea fishing boats, and also Articles four, five, six, seven, and eight of the Convention then recently concluded between Her Majesty and the Emperor of the French concerning the Fisheries in the seas adjoining the British Islands and France, and set out in the first Schedule to the Act.
- (b.) To adopt in such regulations any existing system of registering or lettering and numbering of boats, and to provide for bringing any such system into conformity with the requirements of the said Convention and the Act, and with the said regulations.

which such regulations, or any of them, are to apply; and to provide for the exemption of any boats or classes of boats from such regulations, or any of them, and from the provisions of Part II. of the Act with respect to entry or registry, and the possession of a certificate of registry and official papers.

- (d.) To apply to the entry and registry respectively of sea fishing boats so defined, and to all matters incidental thereto, such (if any) of the enactments contained in any Act relating to the registry of British Ships, and with such modifications and alterations as may be found
- (e.) To impose penalties not exceeding twenty pounds for the breach of any regulations made by any Order in Council for the breach of which a punishment cannot be provided, by the application of the enactments contained in in any Act relating to the registry of British
- (f.) To alter and revoke an Order so made, and that every such Order shall be of the same force as if it were enacted in the said recited

And whereas Her Majesty did, in pursuance of the said recited Act, on the 18th day of June 1869, by Order in Council make certain regulations for the lettering, numbering, and registering of British sea fishing boats under Part II. of the Act, and did on the 26th day of February 1880, by a further Order in Council, make certain additional regulations for the same purpose, all of which regulations are now in force:

And whereas by Regulation 6 of the Regula-(c.) To define the boats or classes of boats to tions made by Her Majesty on the 18th June 1869 aforesaid it is provided that there shall be series of numbers and distinguishing letters for the boats belonging to each Collectorship of Customs, and that the letters thereinafter given shall be the distinguishing letters:

And whereas the port of Barrow-in-Furness, formerly a creek within the port of Lancaster, has been erected into an independent Port for Customs purposes:

And whereas it has been made to appear that it is expedient that numbers and letters should be assigned to fishing boats belonging to the Collectorship of Customs at Barrow-in-Furness:

And whereas it has also been made to appear to be expedient that in any case of a Customs Port being reduced to the position of a creek, or merged in any way in another Customs Port, the distinguishing letters theretofore used for the boats belonging to the port so reduced or merged, may be used as alternative letters for the enlarged port:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to make the regulations which are set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, and to direct that the same shall come into force from the date of the present Order.

Additional Regulations for the Lettering, Numbering, and Registering of British Sea Fishing Boats under Part II. of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868 (31 and 32 Victoria, Chapter 45).

- 1. There shall be a series of numbers and distinguishing letters for fishing boats belonging to the Collectorship of Barrow-in-Furness, and the distinguishing letters shall be B.W.
- 2. In any case of a Customs Port being reduced to the position of a creek, or merged in any way in another Customs Port, the distinguishing letters theretofore used for the boats belonging to the Port so reduced or merged, may be used as alternative letters for the enlarged port.


