CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, July 21, 1892.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

Special Regulations (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situations of Draughtsman in the Department of the Director of Engineering and Architectural Works in the Admiralty, at the Outports, and of Second Assistant to Second Class Surveyors in the Office of Her Majesty's Works, &c.

I. The limits of age for these situations are 24 and 30, and candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the competitive examination.

II. Candidates will be required to show what preliminary training or technical education they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must have served in a public or private office under an Architect or
