GREENOCK AND WEMYSS BAY RAILWAY.

(Power to Raise Additional Shares; Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Session for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter called the Bill) for the purposes following, or some of them, that is to say:—

To empower the Greenock and Wemyss Bay Railway Company (hereinafter called the Company) to raise by the creation and issue of new ordinary shares or stock, and upon such terms and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by the Bill, additional money for defraying the expense of works executed and authorized to be executed, and of lands acquired and authorized to be acquired by the Company, and of improvements on the stations, sidings, pier, and other works, forming part of the undertaking of the Company, and for other purposes of the Company for which funds have not been provided, or for which the funds provided have proved insufficient.

To vary or extinguish any existing rights or privileges which might in any way interfere with or prevent the execution of the object aforesaid, and to confer upon the Company all powers, rights, and privileges necessary or expedient for carrying the same into effect, or in relation thereto.

To amend and, so far as necessary for the object aforesaid, to repeal, in whole or in part, the provisions, or some of the provisions, of the Greenock and Wemyss Bay Railway Act (1862), and the Greenock and Wemyss Bay Railway Extension Act (1863), and any other Acts recited in or referred to in those Acts, or relating to the Company.

Printed Copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 21st day of December 1882.

TELEGRAPH CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE COMPANY, LIMITED.

(Removal of doubts as to meaning of Memorandum of Association, and extension of the Objects of the Company as defined thereby, &c., &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session thereof, by or on behalf of the Telegraph Construction and Maintenance Company, Limited (in this Notice referred to as 'The Company'), for an Act for effecting the purposes or some of the purposes following, that is to say:—

To remove doubts as to the meaning of the Company's Memorandum of Association, dated the 6th day of April 1864, and to extend the objects for which the Company was established as defined by that Memorandum, and to include amongst those

objects the construction, laying down, maintenance, purchasing, hiring, letting, selling, working, and use of works and apparatus for the production and use of electric and magnetic or any other force for any purpose whatsoever; and the purchase, importation, manufacture, and sale of all materials, articles, and things in any way used or connected with the production, transmission, and use of electric and magnetic or any other force.

To confer upon the Company all such powers, rights, and privileges as may be necessary or expedient for effecting the objects aforesaid, and to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would in any way interfere with the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

GREENOCK ELECTRIC LIGHTING.

(Supply of Electricity within the Burgh of Greenock; Construction of Works for Manufacture and Supply; Acquisition of Lands, etc.; Manufacture and Storage of Electricity; Supply of Electricity and of Electrical Apparatus; Acquisition of Patent Rights, etc.; Breaking up and other Interference with Streets, etc.; Levying of Rates and Charges; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts, and other Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, That the Board of Police of Greenock (hereinafter called 'The Board of Police') intend to apply to the Board of Trade on or before the 21st day of December next, for a Provisional Order under 'The Electric Lighting Act, 1882' (in this Notice called 'The Electric Lighting Act') for the following, or some of the following, powers and purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Board of Police to produce, manufacture, store, supply, sell, or distribute electricity, for all or any purpose, including public and private purposes as defined by the Electric Lighting Act, and on such terms and conditions and under such regulations and for such price or other consideration as the Order may define or the Board of Trade or Parliament may sanction within the following area (which is in this Notice referred to as the area of supply), that is to say:

The Burgh of Greenock as defined by 'The Greenock Burgh Extension Act, 1882,' in the County of Renfrew, and, if deemed expedient, to divide the area of supply into districts, and to supply electricity to any such district upon such terms with regard to remuneration and price as shall be fair and reasonable and as shall be agreed to by the Board of Police, and to authorise
