AT THE COURT AT BALMORAL,  
September 3, 1883.

**T**HE Queen, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been graciously pleased, by Letters Patent under Her Royal Sign Manual, and the Great Seal of the Order, bearing date this day, to dispense with all the Statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to Installation, and to grant unto Her Most Gracious Majesty's grandson, His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor Christian Edward (eldest son of His Royal Highness Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, K.G.), Knight of the said Most Noble Order, and duly invested with the Ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the aforesaid Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if His Royal Highness had been formally installed; any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.
