#### Preamble.

1, 2. Transference of Property, and Discharge of present Governing Body.

3-6. Conduct of Business, Power of Sale, &c., Accounts and Audit.

7. Preservation of Vested Interests. — The governing body shall continue to pay to the present schoolmasters at Tinwald and Shieldhill, the shares of the income of the Endowment presently paid to them, and on the expiry of the said vested interests, shall apply the income in the manner provided in the following section.
