WRIGHT'S PATENT FOR 'IMPROVEMENTS IN PAINT BRUSHES.'

(Confirmation of Patent and Assignments thereof.)

APPPLICATION has been made to Parliament for leave to deposit a Petition for a Bill to revive and render valid or confirm certain Letters Patent, dated the 22d day of October 1880 (No. 4319), granted to Edward Wright, of Beckenham, in the County of Kent, his executors, administrators, and assigns, for the invention of 'Improvements in Paint Brushes,' for the term of fourteen years from the date of such Letters Patent, and to authorise the payment of the prolongation duty of £50 upon the said Letters Patent, which became due and payable on or before the 22d day of October 1883, and upon such payment being made, to enable the Commissioners of Patents or their Clerk to stamp the said Letters Patent, or a duplicate thereof; and also to confirm or give effect to all or any Assignments or Dispositions of the said Letters Patent which have been made or executed previous or subsequent to the last-mentioned date.
