CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant in the Herbarium, Royal Gardens, Kew, in the Department of Her Majesty's Works, &c.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration.

I. The examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic (Elementary).
4. Elements of Systematic and Structural Botany.
5. The naming of plants by the British Flora.

NOTE.—Candidates will be required to show what preliminary training or technical education they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature, and they must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they possess the special qualifications necessary for the office. These include manual skill and neat-handedness in preserving, arranging, and ticketing specimens of plants, and in displaying their parts for study;—some practice in the use of the microscope;—and quickness and accuracy of eye in comparing and discriminating between species and varieties of plants, in both the Herbarium and Garden. On these points the Commissioners will ask for a report from the Director of Kew Gardens.

II. Candidates failing in any of the above-named subjects will not be eligible.

III. A fee will be required from every candidate attending an examination, according to the scale laid down under the Order in Council of 22d March 1879, by notice in the London Gazette of 29th April 1881.

IV. No candidate will be eligible whose age on the first day of the examination is less than 18 or more than 30.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Assistant in the Herbarium Royal Gardens, Kew, in the Department of Her Majesty's Works, &c., will be held in London, on Wednesday the 25th June 1884, and following days, under the above Regulations.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the examination. The number now vacant is one.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commissioners has not received, on or before the 16th June, an 'application' in the handwriting of the candidate, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

EDUCATIONAL ENDOWMENTS
(SCOTLAND) ACT, 1882.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Commissioners under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, have prepared the Draft of a Scheme for the future administration of the Endowment known as the NEW EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION, in the County of Ayr and Parish of Mauchline, whereof an abstract is appended. The Commissioners will, in terms of the Twenty-fourth Section of said Act, receive and consider any objection made to them in writing by any public body or persons interested respecting such Scheme, and any amendments proposed thereon, provided that the same be delivered at their Office, at No. 46 George Street, Edinburgh, within two calendar months from the date hereof. Scheme, under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, for the Administration of the Endowment in the Parish of Mauchline and County of Ayr, known as the New Educational Institution, hitherto held and administered under Trust Deed by James Stewart, dated 12th August 1847.

Preamble.

1 and 2. Future Administration. Transference of Property.

3. Constitution and Election of Governing Body.—The governing body, hereinafter called the governors, shall be constituted as follows:—

Three shall be elected by the School Board of the parish of Mauchline.

Two shall be elected by the Heritors of the parish of Mauchline.

Two shall be elected by the existing Trustees of the said James Stewart, to hold office for their lives.

The governors elected by the said School Board shall, in the case of the first election, hold

office for a period of five years, and thereafter until the first day of August after the expiry of that period. The governors elected by the said heritors shall, in the case of the first election, hold office for a period of three years, and thereafter until the first day of August after the expiry of that period. The governors shall, in the case of all elections subsequent to the first, hold office for a period of five years, from and after the expiry of the term of office of their predecessors, except as hereinafter provided. Each election shall be made at a meeting convened and conducted according to the ordinary rules and practice of the electing body. The governors may be elected by the several electing bodies either out of their own number or otherwise. Any governor may be re-elected. The first governors shall be elected as soon as conveniently may be after the date of this Scheme. The clerk or other officer of the governors shall, at least one month before the expiry of the term of office of any governor, give notice to the proper electing body, who shall as soon as conveniently may be after such notice, elect a governor to hold office from the expiry of said term. Any election not made as aforesaid within three months from the date of this Scheme, or from the date of the notice of expiry of a term of office, or from the date of the notice of a vacancy, as hereinafter prescribed, shall in that case be made by the then existing governors.

4-10. Clauses relating to Vacancies, Meetings, Chairman, Quorum, and Minutes.

11-21. Committees, Accounts, Business Arrangements, Powers of Sale and Investment, Audit, Transference of Administration.

22. Discontinuance of School Buildings.—The governors shall, within twelve months after the date of this Scheme, discontinue the school presently maintained in the school buildings of the New Educational Institution; they shall offer the said school buildings, with the site, pertinents, and furnishings thereof, to the School Board of Mauchline, at the price of £800; and in the event of the said School Board not agreeing to purchase the same at the said price within twelve months, they shall sell the same by public roup or let them at a fair rent, as to them may seem best; but, notwithstanding the provisions hereof, they may, on obtaining the authority of the Scotch Education Department, continue the school until such time as may be fixed.

23. Vested Interests.

Application of Income.

24. Application of Income.—The governors, after paying the necessary expenses of management, and the burdens and taxes affecting the Endowment, shall apply the free income of the Endowment in the manner hereinafter provided.

25. Free Scholarships.—The governors shall apply the sum of £30 yearly in paying, in whole or in part as they may think fit, the fees of scholars, with books and stationery, at public or State-aided schools in the parish of Mauchline for elementary education as defined in the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882. The free scholars shall be children whose parents or guardians, not being in receipt of parochial relief, are in such circumstances as to require aid for providing elementary education, and are persons who, in the opinion of the governors, ought not to be required to apply to the Parochial Board for such aid.

In the case of children under ten years of age, the selection of free scholars shall be made with

due regard to merit as ascertained by such examination, suited to the age of the candidates, as the governors may from time to time prescribe; or, in the case of children for whom such examination is unsuitable, by evidence that the children possess such qualifications as to justify their selection; and, in the case of children who have been in attendance at school during one or more school years, the governors shall, in making their selection, give special weight to good conduct, attendance, and progress at school during the previous year. The fees, in respect of children under ten years of age shall not be paid for more than one school year without reappointment, and the amount to be expended in paying fees for such children shall not exceed one-third of the amount to be applied under this section.

In the case of children of ten years of age and upwards, the free scholars shall be selected by competitive examinations, which shall be open to all of the same age who are eligible in terms hereof, whether they have or have not previously been beneficiaries; and for such children the school fees may continue to be paid for such period not exceeding three years as the governors may determine. If any scholar gain a school bursary his school fees shall no longer be paid under this section.

The governors, at the end of every school year, shall obtain from the teacher or teachers a special report as to the conduct, regularity of attendance, and progress of all scholars whose school fees are paid in whole or in part under this section, and the fees of no scholar shall continue to be paid in regard to whom such report is not satisfactory.

The governors may, if they see fit, intrust the carrying out of the provisions of this clause to a committee appointed by them, partly from their own number, and partly from the members of the School Board of Mauchline.

26. Annual Payment to the School Board.—The governors shall pay the annual sum of £30 to the School Board of Mauchline on condition—

- (1) That the School Board shall apply the same for the purposes of higher instruction by providing a sufficient salary to the head teacher of Mauchline Public School, or such other school as they may select for the purpose of giving higher instruction in Mauchline, who shall in the case of any appointment after the date of this Scheme be a graduate of some university in the United Kingdom, and by supplying such assistance as may enable him to devote his attention chiefly to the upper standards, and to the teaching of specific subjects.
- (2) That the sum applied out of the school fund for payment of salaries in the said school shall not be on a lesser scale than the sum applied in Mauchline Public School at the date of this Scheme.
- (3) That the School Board give free education in the said school to not more than ten scholars who have passed the fifth standard, and who shall be selected by the governors by competitive examination under the conditions and regulations of the twenty-eighth section hereof, from scholars attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Mauchline. The free education thus given shall be continued for a period not exceeding

three years, and shall include all specific subjects taught in the school.

The governors shall satisfy themselves from time to time that the said annual payment is applied under the conditions contained herein for the promotion of higher instruction; and, if it appears to them that the said annual payment is not so applied, they shall withdraw the same, provided always that, if the said School Board object thereto, the consent of the Scotch Education Department shall be obtained before the withdrawal of the said annual payment.

27. Application of Annual Payment to School Board in event of Withdrawal.—In the event of the School Board declining to accept the said annual payment under the conditions of the immediately preceding section, or in the event of its being at any time withdrawn under the provisions thereof, the governors shall apply the said annual sum to the purposes of the thirtieth section hereof.

28. Bursaries.—The governors shall apply the annual sum of £30 in establishing school bursaries, to be called the Stewart School Bursaries, each of the yearly value of not less than £5 nor more than £10. These bursaries shall be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools within three miles of the village of Mauchline, who have passed the fifth standard of the present Scotch Code, or such standard as may from time to time be fixed by the Scotch Education Department pursuant to the Education (Scotland) Acts, as that entitling children to total exemption from the obligation to attend school, and whose parents or guardians are in such circumstances as to require aid for giving them higher education; these bursaries shall be tenable for two years at public or State-aided schools in which efficient instruction is given in the higher branches.

29. Apprentice Allowances.—The governors may, if they think fit, allow any child who has been successful in the competition for the bursaries established by the immediately preceding section, after holding the bursary for one year at a public or State-aided school, in which efficient instruction is given in the higher branches, and after passing the sixth standard, to take in lieu of the second year of the said bursary an allowance not exceeding one-half of the amount fixed by the governors as the annual value of the said bursary, on condition that he or she shall be apprenticed to some trade or handicraft, and shall attend evening classes or other course of instruction to be approved by the governors; but not more than £10 annually of the sum applied under the immediately preceding section shall be expended in such allowances. The governors shall obtain a report as to the character and efficiency of the instruction given, and of the attendance and progress of the holder of the allowance.

30. Bursaries for Higher or Technical Education.—The governors shall apply the remainder of the free income in establishing bursaries for higher education, to be called the Stewart Bursaries, each of the yearly value of not less than £10 nor more than £15. These bursaries shall be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parishes of Mauchline, Sorn, and Stair, whose age at the date of the competition shall not exceed fourteen years; they shall be tenable for such period, not exceeding three years, as the governors may determine, at such schools for higher education or technical instruction as they may approve.

31. Forfeiture of Bursaries.—If, in the judgment of the governors, the holder of any bursary shall be guilty of serious misconduct, or fail to make reasonable progress, they may withdraw such bursary, and their determination in such case shall be final.

32. Annual Distribution of Bursaries.—The governors shall establish the bursaries herein provided for in such manner as to secure that they shall be awarded in as nearly as possible equal numbers in each year.

33. Residue of Income.—The residue of the free annual income, in so far as it has not been applied under the provisions of this Scheme, shall be invested by the governors as soon as it shall amount to £50, and form part of the capital fund of the Endowment.
