The Queen, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been graciously pleased by Letters Patent under Her Royal Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the said Order, bearing date this day, to dispense with all the Statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to Installation, and grant unto the Most Noble George Douglas, Duke of Argyll, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, and the Right Honourable Edward Henry, Earl of Derby, Knights of the said Most Noble Order, and duly invested with the Ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise, respectively, all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the said Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if they had been formally installed, any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.
