



ORKNEY ROADS.

(Amendment of Roads and Bridges (Scotland)
Act, 1878, so far as the same affects Roads in
the County of Orkney, and specially Amending
and Varying the Provisions of that Act with
respect to the Payment of the Debts on those
Roads; Provision for Payment of Debts by
Insular Districts; Insular Districts respectively
to be liable only for the Debts of the respective
Districts; Farther Provisions with respect to
the Orkney Roads Acts, 1857 and 1867.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for an Act (hereinafter called the intended Act) to amend or repeal so much of the

Act of the 41st and 42d years of Her present Majesty, chapter 51, intituled 'An Act to Alter and Amend the Law in regard to the Maintenance and Management of Roads and Bridges in Scotland' (therein and hereinafter called the Roads and Bridges (Scotland) Act 1878), as repealed the Orkney Roads Act 1857 and the Orkney Roads Act 1867 from and after the 1st day of June 1883, and made other provisions, inter alia, for repayment of the road debt affecting the Roads in any county in Scotland, by an assessment on the whole lands and heritages in the county as appearing in the Valuation Roll.

To provide that, notwithstanding the provisions and enactments contained in the Roads and Bridges (Scotland) Act 1878, the incidence of debt on the several insular districts of the County of Orkney shall henceforward continue to be as the same existed at the date of coming into operation of that Act, and that such debt and interest thereon shall be repayable by the proprietors of the several districts in the manner prescribed by that Act, as if the said districts had constituted separate counties for the purposes thereof, and that the insular districts shall only be liable for the debts (if any) of those respective districts.

To re-enact, so far as may be necessary or expedient (and with such amendments as may be requisite), all or some of the provisions of the Orkney Roads Act 1857 and the Orkney Roads Act 1867.

To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would in any way interfere with the purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

Printed copies of the Bill for the intended Act will, on or before the 21st day of December next, be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.

CLYDE NAVIGATION.

(Extension of Time for Compulsory Purchase of Lands and Completion of Works; Provisions for Collecting and Enforcing Payment of Rates, Tolls, and Duties; Appointment of Master-Porters, Meters, Weighers, and other Officers; Power to Clyde Pilot Board to enter into Agreements with Proprietors and Lessees of Harbours, Piers, &c., in River and Firth of Clyde, for, or to require the Erection, Maintenance, and working by such Proprietors or Lessees of Signals for Regulating the Pilotage and Approach of Steam Vessels; Confirmation of Agreements; Bye-Laws, Officers, and Rates for Working Signals; Incorporation, Amendment or Repeal of Acts; and other Purposes.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill (herein-

Act of the 41st and 42d years of Her present after called 'the Bill') for effecting the objects Majesty, chapter 51, intituled 'An Act to Alter and purposes aftermentioned, or some of them, and Amend the Law in regard to the Maintenance that is to say:—

To extend the time limited by the Clyde Navgation Act, 1883, for the compulsory purchase of lands, houses, and other property for the purposes of the said Act, and also for the completion of the

works thereby authorised.

To provide for the collection of the rates, tolls, and duties leviable under the Clyde Navigation Consolidation Act, 1858, and the Acts amending the same, or relating to or affecting the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation (hereinafter called 'the Trustees,') and for the imposition and enforcement of fines or penalties on the owners, masters, agents, or other persons in charge of vessels leaving the Harbour of Glasgow before payment is made of the rates, tolls, and duties leviable in respect of such vessels, or in respect of all or any part of the cargoes of such vessels.

To authorise the Trustees to appoint and license, from time to time, as they may think fit, Master-Porters, Meters, Weighers, Measurers, and Stevedores, within the limits of the said Harbour; to make regulations for the control and conduct of such Master-Porters, Meters, Weighers, Measurers, and Stevedores; and to fix the rates to be paid or remuneration to be made for Storing, Weighing, Measuring, Stowing, and Discharging

of Cargoes within the said limits.

To authorise the Clyde Pilot Board, constituted under the powers contained in the said Clyde Navigation Consolidation Act, 1858 (hereinafter called 'the Pilot Board') to enter into and earry into effect Agreements with the Proprietorswhether in their own right, or as Trustees, Commissioners, or Conservators-or with the Lessees of all or any Harbour, Piers, Quays, or Wharfs in that part of the River or Firth of Clyde extending from the western limits of the jurisdiction of the Trustees to a straight line drawn due east and west from the southernmost point of the Island of Little Cumbrae, for the erection, maintenance, working, and use, on or near to such Harbours, Piers, Quays, or Wharfs respectively, of Semaphore Signals, or other Signalling apparatus which may be deemed necessary, and which may be approved of by the Board of Trade, for regulating the pilotage and approach of steam vessels calling at, or using such Harbours, Piers, Quays, or Wharfs; or otherwise, to empower and require the said Proprietors or Lessees to erect, maintain, work, and use on or near to such Harbours, Piers, Quays, or Wharfs respectively, such Semaphore Signals, or other Signalling apparatus as aforesaid.

To authorise the Pilot Board to make and alter bye-laws, rules, and regulations, for the working and use of the said Semaphore Signals, or other Signalling apparatus, and to impose and recover penalties for the breach or non-observance of such bye-laws, rules, and regulations; to appoint officers for carrying into effect the said bye-laws, rules, and regulations; to levy such rates or dues as may be found necessary for defraying the expenses connected with the working and use of the said Semaphore Signals, and other Signalling apparatus—but such rates or dues not in any case to exceed One Shilling per day, leviable on any Steam Vessel calling at or using any such Harbour. Pier, Quay, or Wharf, as aforesaid; and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from the payment of such rates or dues.

To provide for the collection of the said Rates

or Dues in respect of Signals, by the Pier-masters or other persons to be appointed by the Pilot Board as aforesaid, and for the accounting therefor to, and the administration thereof by, the Pilot Board; and to enable the Pilot Board, the said Proprietors or Lessees, and the Pier-masters, or any of them, to enter into and make Agreements with each other, for all or any of the purposes above mentioned, and to confirm all Agreements which have been or may be entered into in relation thereto; and for the purposes aforesaid, to confer upon the said Proprietors, Lessees, or Pier-masters all necessary powers for carrying such Agreements into effect.

To confer on the Pilot Board and on the said Proprietors, Lessees, or Pier-masters, subject to such alterations or modifications as may be provided in the Bill, all or some of the powers or privileges authorised by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and Acts amending the same.

To incorporate with the Bill, subject to such alterations or modifications as may be provided therein, all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845, the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860, the Railways Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845, the Railways Clauses Act, 1863. the Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847, and Acts amending the said Acts, or any of them.

To alter, amend, enlarge, or repeal, so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the Bill, the Clyde Navigation Consolidation Act, 1858, and all other Acts amending that Act or relating to or affecting the Clyde Navigation and the Pilot Board, and all other Local or Public Acts relating to or affecting the said several Harbours, Piers, Quays, or Wharfs, in the River and Firth of Clyde, within the limits aforesaid.

To vary or extinguish all powers, rights, and privileges which would in any manner interfere with or prevent the execution of the objects and purposes of the Bill, or any of them; and to confer all such powers, rights, and privileges as may be necessary for carrying into effect the objects and purposes of the existing Acts relating to the undertaking of the Trustees, and of the Bill

PETERHEAD HARBOUR OF REFUGE.

(Construction of Breakwater Piers, Retaining Wall or Quay, Railway, Road, and other Works at and near Peterhead; Compulsory Purchase of Lands; Tolls; Appointment of Harbour Master, &c.; Extinguishment of Fishery and other Rights, Bye-Laws, Agreements with Local Bodies; Incorpora-

tion and Amendment of Acts and other purposes.)

OTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill and to pass an Act for all or some of the following purposes:—

- 1. To enable the Lord High Admiral or the Commissioners for the time being for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral or some other Public Department of Her Majesty's Government (in this notice severally and collectively referred to as the Promoters) to form a Harbour of Refuge at Peterhead, in the County of Aberdeen, and for that purpose to make and maintain, in connection therewith, Breakwater Piers, Retaining Wall or Quay, Railway, Road, and Works hereinafter mentioned, or some of them, or some part or parts thereof, with all proper entrances, buildings, sheds, work and other yards, warehouses, quays, wharves, viaduets, roads, embankments, jetties, water and coaling stations, groynes, approaches, bridges, lifts, pontoons, machinery, appliances, apparatus and conveniences connected therewith respectively that is to say
 - (a) A Breakwater Pier to be situate in the Parish of Peterhead, in the County of Aberdeen, and the bed of the sea, commencing at or near the South-east corner of the reclaimed land at Keith Inch, Peterhead, and thence proceeding in a South-westerly direction for a distance of 1000 feet or thereabouts, and terminating in the bed of the sea.
 - (b) A retaining Wall or Quay to be wholly situate in the said Parish of Peterhead, commencing from the North-west side of the last-mentioned Breakwater Pier at a point about 80 yards from the commencement thereof, and thence continuing for a distance of about 117 yards in a North-westerly direction to the South-west corner of the reclaimed land at Keith Inch aforesaid, and there terminating; and to level the land on and adjoining the North-west side of such retaining wall.
 - (c) A Breakwater Pier to be situate in the said Parish of Peterhead and the bed of the sea, commencing at a point 17 yards or thereabouts Eastward of the North-east corner of the wall surrounding the property at Salthouse Head known as 'St. Catherine's,' and continuing in a North-easterly direction for a distance of 3200 feet or thereabouts, and terminating in the bed of the sea at a point distant 600 feet or thereabouts, measured in a South-westerly direction. from the point of termination of the Breakwater Pier hereinbefore described.
- 2. To empower the promoters to make and maintain the Railway hereinafter described, with all necessary stations, junctions, approaches, sidings, works and conveniences connected therewith (that is to say):
 - A Railway to be wholly situate in the said Parish of Peterhead, commencing at the aforesaid point 17 yards or thereabouts Eastward of the North-east corner of the wall surrounding the property at Salthouse Head, known as 'St. Catherines,' and terminating at Sterling Hill at a point about 430 yards or thereabouts South-south-east

of the Farm House of Whinbush in the easements in or over the same, for the purposes of said Parish.

3. To enable the promoters to make and maintain:

A new Road situate wholly in the said Parish of Peterhead commencing at a point in the road leading East-south-east from the Farm House of Whinbush and 200 yards or thereabouts distant from the said house and terminating at a point in the road leading West-north-west from the Farm House at Sterling Hill occupied by Jane Ogston or Mackenzie and others, and 100 yards or thereabouts distant from the said last-mentioned house.

And the Bill will or may authorise the promoters to stop up so much of the existing Roads and footpaths as lie within the limits of deviation defined upon the plans hereinafter mentioned and vest in the promoters or adjoining landowners the sites and soil of the roads and footpaths so intended to be stopped up and to extinguish all rights of way and other rights over or affecting the same or

some part or parts thereof respectively.

4. To make provision for the appointment of a Harbour Master and other Officers and Servants and to confer upon such Harbour Master and Officers exclusive rights in connection with the mooring of vessels, boats and other craft, and the regulation and good government of the proposed Harbour of Refuge, and to define the limits within which the powers of such Harbour Master and Officers shall be exercised, and to extinguish the rights of any Harbour Master or other public Officer or person within the proposed Harbour and the limits defined upon the plans to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned.

5. To make bye-laws, rules, and regulations, for the management, use, regulation, and protection of the intended works and the regulation and control of ships and vessels, persons, animals, and goods frequenting or using the same and the imposition

of penalties and restrictions.

6. To make provision for the extinguishment of all Fishing and other rights within the limits of

the proposed Harbour.

7. To authorise the purchase and taking of a portion of certain Common or Commonable Lands in the said Parish of Peterhead called or known by the name of West Links and Bleaching Green, of which it is estimated that 4 acres or thereabouts are intended to be taken by the Promoters and to make provision as to the sale to the Promoters by the Owners of or others interested in said Common or Commonable Land, of the portion

so required.

8. To enable the Promoters to quarry stone. dredge, scour, and deepen from time to time the foreshore and bed of the sea within, adjoining, or near to the said Parish of Peterhead, and within the limits of deviation defined upon the plans hereinafter mentioned, and to remove, carry away and dispose of any stone, gravel, sand, shingle, or other substances taken up or collected by means of such quarrying, dredging, or scouring, as afore-

said.

9. To deviate laterally from the lines and vertically from the levels of the said Breakwater Piers, Retaining Wall or Quay, Railway, Road, and Works, as shown upon the said Plans and Sections, to such an extent as may be authorised by the said Bill.

10. To purchase, take, and acquire, compulsorily or otherwise, lands, houses, and other property or

the said Breakwater Piers, Retaining Wall or Quay, Railway, Road, and Works, and for the general purposes of the Bill, and to vary or extinguish any fishing or other rights and privileges which would in any way interfere with the objects thereof.

11. To authorise the levying of tolls, rates, duties and charges for, or in connection with, the use of the said Harbour, Breakwater Piers, Retaining Wall or Quay, Railway, Road, and Works; to confer, vary, or repeal exemptions from the payment of tolls, rates and duties; and to confer, vary, alter, and extinguish all rights and privileges which would, or might, interfere with the objects and purposes of the Bill.

12.
