**EDUCATIONAL ENDOWMENTS  
(SCOTLAND) ACT, 1882.**

NOTICE is hereby given that the Commissioners under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, have prepared the Drafts of Schemes for the future administration of the Endowments undernoted, whereof abstracts are appended:—

- No. 1. Adamson Bequest, Bogie Trust, and Martin Trust, in the County of Fife and Parish of Ceres;
- No. 2. Duncan Bequest and Bogie Trust, in the County of Fife and Parish of Dairsie;
- No. 3. Bell Fund and Glass Fund, in the County of Fife and Parish of Strathmiglo;
- No. 4. Ferguson and Bell Fund, in the County of Fife and Parish of Collossie.

The Commissioners will, in terms of the Twenty-fourth Section of said Act, receive and consider any objection made to them in writing by any public body or persons interested respecting such Schemes, and any amendments proposed thereon, provided that the same be delivered at their Office, at No. 46 George Street, Edinburgh, within two calendar months from the date hereof. No. 1.—Scheme, under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, for the Administration of the Endowment in the Parish of

Ceres and County of Fife, known as Adamson's Bequest, hitherto held and administered under Will by Alexander Adamson, dated 11th December 1865, with Codicil, dated 13th July 1866, both recorded in the Sheriff Court Books at Cupar 10th September 1866; the Bogie Trust, so far as applicable to the Parish of Ceres, hitherto held and administered under Trust Deed by Alexander Bogie, dated 9th October 1869, and recorded in the Sheriff Court Books at Cupar 29th September 1870; and the Martin Trust, so far as applicable to the Parish of Ceres, presently held and administered by the Presbytery of Kincardine O'Neil.

1. Transference of Property and Administration to New Governing Body.—From and after the date of this Scheme the trustees under the Trust Deed of the said Alexander Bogie shall pay to the School Board of Ceres the annual sum directed to be paid for the benefit of the parish of Ceres, so long as it shall continue payable under the provisions of the said Trust Deed; the Presbytery of Kincardine O'Neil shall pay to the said School Board the annual sum of £4, as the proportion of the Martin Trust payable to the parish of Ceres; the whole rights, funds, and estates, heritable and moveable, belonging to the Adamson Bequest, or vested in the present governing body thereof, shall be transferred to, and vested in the School Board of the parish of Ceres, without the necessity of any new conveyance or instrument, and shall, together with the said annual payment, be held and administered, by them as one Endowment under the conditions and provisions of this Scheme, and the said School Board shall be the governing body of the Endowment.

#### Operative Clauses.

10. Free Scholarships at Public Schools.—The governing body shall apply the whole or any part they may think fit of the yearly sum payable to them under the Bogie Trust in paying the fees of poor and deserving children, with books and stationery, at public or State-aided schools in the parish of Ceres who have passed in the third or higher standards of the Scotch Code, and whose parents or guardians, not being in receipt of parochial relief, are in such circumstances as to require aid in providing elementary education, and are persons who, in the opinion of the governing body, should not be required to apply to the Parochial Board for aid in paying school fees. These free scholarships shall be awarded on the result of a competitive examination, or as a reward for regularity of attendance, industry, general merit, and good conduct, all to be ascertained by the report of the teachers, and otherwise as the governing body may determine. Any payment under this clause shall be withdrawn in the case of children who fail to give regular attendance or make satisfactory progress at school. In so far as the said yearly sum is not applied under this section, it shall be applied to the purposes of the immediately succeeding section.

11. Bursaries.—On the expiry of the vested interests of the schoolmasters at Baldinnie and Craighothie, the governing body shall apply the income of the Martin Trust and of the Adamson Bequest, together with any proportion they may

think fit, of the income of the Bogie Trust, to either of the following objects:—(1) They may establish a bursary for higher education, to be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Ceres, whose parents or guardians require aid in giving them higher education, subject to such conditions as to age or otherwise as the governing body may think fit; it shall be tenable for such period, not exceeding three years, as the governing body may determine, at such schools for higher education or technical instruction as they may approve. (2) They may establish school bursaries each of the yearly value of not less than £3, to be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Ceres, who have passed the fifth standard of the present Scotch Code, or such standard as may from time to time be fixed by the Scotch Education Department, pursuant to the Education (Scotland) Acts, as that entitling children to total exemption from the obligation to attend school, and whose parents or guardians are in such circumstances as to require aid for giving them higher education; these bursaries shall be tenable for two years at public or State-aided schools in which efficient instruction is given in the higher branches.

No. 2.—Scheme, under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, for the Administration of the Endowments in the Parish of Dairsie and County of Fife known as the Duncan Bequest, as far as applicable to Educational purposes, hitherto held and administered under Trust Disposition and Settlement by Miss Anne Duncan, dated 1st April 1864, with codicil dated 22d December 1865, recorded in the Sheriff Court Books at Cupar 31st August 1867; and Bogie's Trust so far as applicable to the parish of Dairsie, hitherto held and administered under Trust Deed by Alexander Bogie, dated 9th October 1869, and recorded in the Sheriff Court Books at Cupar 29th September 1870.

1. Transference of Property and Administration to New Governing Body.—From and after the date of this Scheme the said Endowments, so far as applicable to educational purposes, shall be amalgamated, and shall be held and administered under the conditions and provisions of this Scheme by the School Board of the parish of Dairsie, together with two representatives elected by the Kirk-session of the parish of Dairsie, in such manner and for such period as the said Kirk-session may see fit, and the said School Board, together with the said representatives of the Kirk-session, shall be the governing body of the Endowment. The Kirk-session of Dairsie, as trustees of the said Duncan Bequest, shall pay to the said governing body the annual sum of £12, and shall transfer to the said governing body the whole sum of accumulations of the said annual sum, so far as not expended for the purpose described in the Trust Disposition of the said Miss Anne Duncan, to be held by the said governing body as a capital sum belonging to said Endowment. The trustees under the Trust Deed of the said Alexander Bogie shall pay to the said governing body the annual sum directed to be paid for the benefit of the parish of Dairsie, so long as it shall con-



tinue payable under the provisions of the said deed.

Operative Clauses.

9. Free Scholarships at Public Schools.—The governing body shall apply the whole or any part they may think fit of the yearly sum payable to them under the Bogie Trust in paying the fees of poor and deserving children, with books and stationery, at public or State-aided schools in the parish of Dairsie, who have passed in the third or higher standards of the Scotch Code, and whose parents or guardians, not being in receipt of parochial relief, are in such circumstances as to require aid in providing elementary education, and are persons who, in the opinion of the governing body, should not be required to apply to the Parochial Board for aid in paying school fees. These free scholarships shall be awarded on the result of a competitive examination, or as a reward for regularity of attendance, industry, general merit, and good conduct, all to be ascertained by the report of the teachers and otherwise as the governing body may determine. Any payment under this clause shall be withdrawn in the case of children who fail to give regular attendance or make satisfactory progress at school.

10. Bursaries.—The governing body shall apply the income from the Duncan Bequest, together with any proportion they may think fit of the payment from the Bogie Trust, to either of the following objects:—(1) They may establish a bursary for higher education, to be called the Duncan Bursary, which shall be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Dairsie, whose parents or guardians require aid in giving them higher education, subject to such conditions as to age or otherwise as the governing body may think fit; it shall be tenable for such period, not exceeding three years, as the governing body may determine, at such schools for higher education or technical instruction as they may approve; (2) they may establish school bursaries, to be called the Duncan School Bursaries, each of the yearly value of not less than £5 nor more than £10, which shall be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Dairsie, who have passed the fifth standard of the present Scotch Code, or such standard as may from time to time be fixed by the Scotch Education Department, pursuant to the Education (Scotland) Acts, as that entitling children to total exemption from the obligation to attend school, and whose parents or guardians are in such circumstances as to require aid for giving them higher education. These bursaries shall be tenable for two years at public or State-aided schools in which efficient instruction is given in the higher branches.

No. 3.—Scheme, under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, for the Administration of the Endowments in the Parish of Strathmiglo and County of Fife, known as the Bell Fund, hitherto held and administered by the Kirk-Session of the Parish of Strathmiglo, and the Glass Fund, presently held and administered by the Heritors of the Parish of Strathmiglo.

Operative Clause.

7. Application of Income.—The governing

body, after paying the necessary expenses of management and the burdens and taxes affecting the Endowment, shall apply the free annual income to either of the following objects as from time to time they may see fit:—(1) They may establish a bursary for higher education, which shall be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Strathmiglo, whose parents or guardians require aid in giving them higher education, under such conditions and regulations as to age or otherwise as the governing body may determine; the bursary shall be tenable for such period, not exceeding three years, as the governing body may determine, at such schools for higher education or technical instruction as they may approve; or (2) they may establish two school bursaries, which shall be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Strathmiglo, who have passed the fifth standard of the present Scotch Code, or such standard as may from time to time be fixed by the Scotch Education Department, pursuant to the Education (Scotland) Acts, as that entitling children to total exemption from the obligation to attend school, and whose parents or guardians are in such circumstances as to require aid for giving them higher education. These bursaries shall be tenable for two years at public or State-aided schools in which efficient instruction is given in the higher branches.

No. 4.—Scheme, under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, for the Administration of the Endowments in the Parish of Collessie and County of Fife, known as the Ferguson and Bell Fund, hitherto held and administered by the School Board of Collessie.

Operative Clause.

5. Application of Income.—The governing body, after paying the necessary expenses of management and the burdens and taxes affecting the Endowment, shall apply the income to one or other of the following objects as from time to time they see fit:—(a) They may establish a bursary to be awarded by competitive examination among children attending the public or State-aided schools in the parish of Collessie, who have passed the fifth standard of the present Scotch Code, or such standard as may be from time to time fixed by the Scotch Education Department, pursuant to the Education (Scotland) Acts, as that entitling children to total exemption from the obligation to attend school, and whose parents or guardians are in such circumstances as to require aid in giving them higher education. The bursary shall be tenable for two years at public or State-aided schools to be approved by the governing body; or (b) they may apply the income in paying the fees of poor and deserving children, with books and stationery, at public or State-aided schools in the parish of Collessie, who have passed in the fifth standard of the present Scotch Code, and whose parents or guardians are in such circumstances as to require aid in giving them higher education. These free scholarships shall be awarded on the result of a competitive examination, or as a reward for regularity of attendance, industry, general merit, and good conduct, all to be ascertained by

the report of the teachers and otherwise as the governing body may determine. Any payment under this sub-section shall be withdrawn in the case of children who fail to give regular attendance or make satisfactory progress at school; or (c) they may apply the income in giving such prizes as they may think fit in public schools in the parish of Collessie, provided that no prize be awarded to any child who has not passed the fifth standard.

NOTE.—In Nos. 3 and 4 the Endowments are transferred to the respective School Boards, and in all cases the usual clauses are inserted as to Investment, &c.
